**SUBJECT:** Recommendation to accept \$75.00 in donation for the District Attorney's Office Child Advocacy Center equipment, operational, and program needs from the Shuman Trust and authorize Comptroller to make necessary budget amendments. (All Commission Districts).

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### **SUMMARY**

The Washoe County Child Advocacy Center received donations from the community to fund various ongoing needs in equipment, operations, and programs.

### **PREVIOUS ACTION**

On September 19, 2017, the Board accepted \$45,850 in donation for the District Attorney's Office Child Advocacy Center equipment, operational, and program needs from 5 individual and organizational donors.

On June 20, 2017, the Board accepted \$6,862 in donation for the District Attorney's Office Child Advocacy Center equipment, operational, and program needs from 36 individual donors from the Friends of the Child Advocacy Center fundraising event.

On Jun 21, 2016, the Board accepted \$10,604 in donation for the District Attorney's Office Child Advocacy Center equipment, improvements, and operational needs from the Builder's Association of Northern Nevada (\$10,000) and Tiffanie Story (\$604).

### **BACKGROUND**

The mission of the Washoe County Child Advocacy Center will be to ensure the health and safety of the child through a neutral, child-centered environment designed to minimize trauma to the child, provide advocacy for the child and non-offending caregivers and support effective investigations. Local organizations continue to donate to the Child Advocacy Center to help with equipment, operational, and program needs.
