COVID-19

- ▶ Testing is conducted prior to transportation to court

- ▶ Fentanyl issues in the jail were identified through investigations and observation.
 - ▶ Suspects charged with PCS for Sales and related charges.

Welfare of the Inmates


- KRNV showcased our male mental health unit with a news piece that aired July 5th and 6th.
- We graduated several inmates through “Getting Ahead while Getting Out” in July. A former inmate came to speak to the veteran's group about opportunities post-incarceration. This success story is a community member with over 20 adult arrests.
 - Currently a full-time college student on the Deans List with full-time employment.
 - The facilitator of these classes is a FTE paid for by commissary funds.

Welfare of Inmates , 4th Quarter

- ▶ High School Equivalency
 - ▶ 331 active participants
 - ▶ 11 completed
- ▶ Substance Abuse
 - ▶ 1156 inmates partook in classes
 - ▶ 131 completed
- ▶ Domestic Violence/Anger Management
 - ▶ 964 attendees
 - ▶ 46 completed
- ▶ GAWGO
 - ▶ 313 attended
 - ▶ 17 completed
- ▶ Parenting classes
 - ▶ 389

Each completed program qualifies the attendee for a 5-day early release NRS 211. 205 Jail days saved through programs, equivalent to \$113,775.

▶ SNAP

- ▶ Representatives will begin in-person counseling with inmates on July 8th.
 - ▶ Medicaid representative on-site to assist with applications.

▶ DMV

- ▶ Regular meetings with DMV employees, will be partnering to allow inmates to pursue State ID before release or soon after.










FY 21/22 Fights




FY 21/22 4th Quarter Inmate Assistance Program (DSU) Cost Savings

Staffing Update

- ▶ The jail currently has 24 Deputies in Field Training. Most will complete training and be assigned to shifts in late August.
- ▶ 22 began the POST Academy on the 11th and will begin field training in December.
- ▶ 240 Deputies currently assigned to Detention/Courts.
 - ▶ As of Q3, there were 185 working the line and other assignments.
 - ▶ 21 completed their FTO and began working the line.
 - ▶ Detention has sent several to patrol for permanent assignment and training.
