donations [estimated value \$91,946.66] from various businesses, organizations and individuals for Regional Parks and Open Space programs and facilities; and direct the Comptroller's Office to make the

#### **SUMMARY**

Accept a total of \$35,366 in cash and in-kind donations [estimated value \$91,946.66] from various businesses, organizations and individuals for Regional Parks and Open Space programs and facilities.

Washoe County Strategic Objective supported by this item: Stewardship of our Community.

#### PREVIOUS ACTION

Donations are frequently made to the Regional Parks and Open Space programs and facilities and formally accepted by the Board of County Commissioners (Board).

#### **BACKGROUND**

The citizens of Washoe County continue to support our parks, open space and natural resources through their generous donations of time, materials, services and cash. Cash [\$35,366.00] and in-kind donations [estimated value \$91,946.66] have been received for park maintenance, improvements, programming, and to assist with the safety and comfort of our citizens.

Cash donations received are dedicated to the operations and maintenance support for the Lazy 5 Park The Hive, Bowers Mansion, Bartley Ranch Park, Rancho San Rafael Park, for May Museum marketing and programming, for May Arboretum garden memorial brick, adopt a tree, tree pruning, maintenance, and improvements, and materials for Crystal Peak Park planting event.

Estimated values of various in-kind donations received include:

- Lazy 5 Regional Park 20 trees received from Lithia Auto [\$3,664.66],
- May Arboretum north side retaining wall from the May Arboretum Society [\$52,615.00]
- May Arboretum irrigation upgrades from the May Arboretum Society [\$26,167.00]
- May Arboretum staff support from the May Arboretum Society [\$9,500.00]
