SUBJECT: Accept a donation of a K-9 dog, equipment, handler training, and travel costs valued at [\$19,810.00] from Washoe County K9 Partners, to the Washoe County Sheriff's Office K9 Unit. (All Commission Districts)

SUMMARY

It is requested that the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) accept a donation, valued at \$19,810.00 from Washoe County K9 Partners to the Washoe County Sheriff's Office K-9 Unit. Washoe County K9 Partners will donate a WCSO K-9 dog, equipment, and training for a new WCSO K-9 handler. Equipment donated will include a fully trained narcotics K-9 from the prestigious Vohne Liche Kennels, heat alert alarm for the K-9 vehicle, travel and per diem for a WCSO K-9 Master Trainer and a new K-9 handler along with miscellaneous gear to outfit the K-9 and K-9 Unit.

Washoe County Strategic Objective supported by this item: Safe, Secure and Healthy Communities.

BACKGROUND

Washoe County Sheriff's Office K-9's are utilized to detect and locate illegal narcotics and to be proficient in locating evidence and contraband such as firearms or other weapons. The narcotics training fosters the ability of the canine to detect the odors of drugs including, but not limited to, marijuana, cocaine, heroin and methamphetamine. They have been extremely successful as a unit, seizing approximately 1.5 million dollars in drug related currency and 2,265 pounds of illegal substances to include marijuana, methamphetamine, heroin, and cocaine.

FISCAL IMPACT

New K-9 Handler will, per WCSDA contract, receive an additional 10% special pay. However, it is anticipated that K-9s currently in the unit will be retired during the 18/19 fiscal period. To plan for that pending retirement, we are seeking approval for this

donated K9 to be approved so we can maintain the same team size once that retirement occurs. Ongoing costs would be covered by existing Sheriff's Office budget authority in cost center 150830.
