Candidates will satisfy the attorney position and non-attorney position required for the Law Library

SUMMARY

Patricia Halstead seeks appointment and Cortney Young seeks reappointment to the Law Library Board of Trustees. It is recommended that Patricia Halstead serve as an attorney member for a two-year term, expiring on January 31, 2022, and Cortney Young serve as a non-attorney member for a two-year term, expiring January 31, 2022.

PREVIOUS ACTION

In January 2015, the BCC appointed Michael Kattelman to a first term as an attorney member of the Law Library Board of Trustees and Pamela Gullihur to serve a fifth term as a non-attorney member of the Law Library Board of Trustees. In January 2016, the BCC appointed Clayton Brust to a third term as an attorney member of the Law Library Board of Trustees and Teresa Mentzer to a fourth term as a non-attorney member of the Law Library Board of Trustees. In 2017, the BCC appointed Michael Kattelman for a second term as an attorney member of the Law Library Board of Trustees and Pamela Gullihur to serve as a non-attorney member for a sixth term. In 2018, the BCC appointed Clayton Brust to a fourth term as an attorney member of the Law Library Board of Trustees, Cortney Young to a first term as a non-attorney member of the Law Library Board of Trustees, and Kathi Lutsch to a one-year first term as a non-attorney member of the Law Library Board of Trustees. In 2019, the BCC appointed Michael Kattelman to a third term as an attorney member of the Law Library Board of Trustees and Kathi Lutsch

to serve a two-year term as a non-attorney member of the Law Library Board of Trustees. The Law Library Board of Trustees appointed members typically serve a two-year term and meet quarterly.

BACKGROUND

The Law Library Board of Trustees is made up of two attorneys and two non-attorneys appointed by the Board of County Commissioners for two-year terms that overlap. The Board also has three District Judge members designated by the District Court Judges. The Board of Trustees meets on a quarterly basis.

FISCAL IMPACT

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners appoint one attorney member and reappoint one non-attorney member to the Law Library Board of Trustees. It is recommended that Patricia Halstead serve as an attorney member for a two-year term expiring on January 31, 2022 and Cortney Young serve as a non-attorney member for a two-year term expiring January 31, 2022. Candidates will satisfy the attorney position and non-attorney position required for the Law Library Board of Trustees.

Move to approve appointment of one attorney member and reappointment of one non-attorney member to the Law Library Board of Trustees. It is recommended that Patricia Halstead serve as an attorney member for a two-year term expiring on January 31, 2022 and Cortney Young serve as a non-attorney member for a two-year term expiring January 31, 2022. Candidates will satisfy the attorney position and non-attorney position required for the Law Library Board of Trustees.
