 - **SUBJECT:** Recommendation to approve the use of General Fund Contingency in the total amount of [\$600,000] for fiscal year 2022 in accordance with Nevada Revised Statute (NRS) 354.598005 to 1) increase expenditure authority for General Fund departments for cost increases for various Washoe County utilities as well as operations and maintenance and fuel for vehicle fleets due to inflation and crude oil prices in the amount of [\$550,000]; 2) increase cross-fund and cross-functional budget appropriation transfers to the Homelessness Fund in the total amount of [\$50,000] to support an emergency repair to a main water line at the Our Place campus; and direct the Comptroller to make the appropriate cross-fund and cross-functional budget appropriation transfers and cash transfers.[Total fiscal year 2022 impact \$600,000; net fiscal impact \$-0-]. (All Commission Districts)

SUMMARY

Nevada Revised Statute (NRS) 354.598005(5) provides that "budget appropriations may be transferred between functions, funds, or contingency accounts if such a transfer does not increase the total appropriation for any fiscal year and is not in conflict with other statutory provisions". Further, Nevada Revised Statute (NRS) 354.608 states that "no expenditure may be made directly from a contingency account, except as a transfer to the appropriate account...in accordance with the procedure established in NRS 354.598005".

The purpose of this item is to consider approval of the use of the General Fund Contingency account. Approval of this recommendation will align budget authority for expenditures already incurred, or anticipated to be incurred, for Fiscal Year 2022 (FY22), including providing additional resources to General Fund departments for cost increases for various Washoe County utilities as well as operations and maintenance and fuel cost related to increased inflation and crude oil prices. All adjustments are within the Washoe County existing approved FY22 budget.

Approval of these transfers will leave \$400,000 available in FY22 General Fund Contingency.

Washoe County Strategic Objective supported by this item: Fiscal Sustainability

PREVIOUS ACTION

On June 21, 2022, the BCC approved to augment the Equipment Services Fund in the amount of \$400,000 to increase revenue and expense budget authority for diesel and unleaded gasoline.

On April 26, 2022, the BCC approved the use of General Fund Contingency in the total amount of \$7,500,000 for fiscal year 2022 to support Conflict Counsel, Riverhouse, Crossroads, Roads Fund, and Homelessness.

On April 12, 2022, the BCC approved the use of General Fund contingency in the amount of \$428,000, to support reasonable and necessary costs to support the Alternative Sentencing Department operations.

On January 25, 2022, the BCC approved the use of General Fund contingency in the amount of \$335,000, to support reasonable and necessary costs to meet minimum Due Process rights in the Guzman Trial.

On January 25, 2022, the BCC is considering the recommended approval to use General Fund contingency in the amount of \$1,600,000, to support expenses related to the proper preparation for, and to run, elections.

On July 20, 2021, the BCC approved the use of General Fund Contingency in the amount of \$255,000 to support a contract with Well Care. Well Care services include oversight of the operation of a twenty-bed Community Triage Center for those in need of crisis psychiatric services, medical and social detoxification from alcohol or other substances, or co-occurring disorders, for individuals who are 18 years of age or older and are not in need of emergency room care.

On May 18, 2021, the BCC approved the Fiscal Year 2022 Final Washoe County Budget, which included \$11,118,000 of General Fund Contingency. The statutory maximum allowable contingency was recommended and approved for FY22 due to unknown and/or unquantified impacts, including 2021 Legislative actions and pandemic response.

BACKGROUND

The County must stay within its adjusted budget for each fund, with certain very limited exceptions, and by function. To remain compliant with this statutory requirement, a General Fund Contingency account transfer totaling \$600,000 is needed for various increased County utilities as well as vehicle fleet expenditures in operations and maintenance and fuel. This adjustment will cover actual and/or anticipated FY22 fund and functional expenditures.

Approval of these transfers will leave \$400,000 available in FY22 General Fund Contingency.

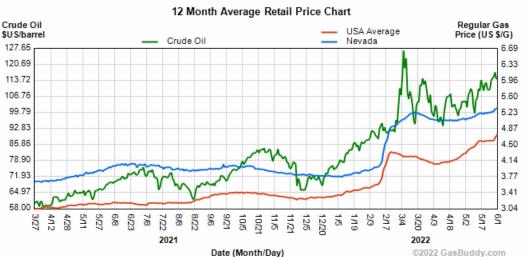
Vehicle Fuel and Operations & Maintenance (O&M):

The economy continues to see increases to inflation and crude oil prices in 2022. The following is market analysis for regular and diesel gas prices compared for one year ago and one month ago as of June 2, 2022:

In FY21, Washoe County had actual expenditures in the General Fund (100) in Fuel and Lube (710391), Equipment Services O&M (711114), and ESD Fuel Charge (711117) in the amount of \$1,848,696 and for FY22 it is predicted to be be \$2,560,517; a 38.5% increase.

According to *chooseenergy.com*, Nevada residents paid, on average, 13.39 cents/kWh in March 2022, comapred to 11.96 cents/kWh in March 2021, representing a 12% increase. The national average increased from 13.30 cents/kWh to 14.47 cents/kWh, or 8.8%. California, Florida, Hawaii, Maine, New Hampshire, and Oklahoma had higher increases than Nevada at 17.6%, 15.9%, 21.3%, 40.3%, 19.4%, and 26.0%, respectively.

Utilities:

Nevada business rates increased 19.6%, from 7.16 cents/kWh to 8.56 cents/kWh. More information is available at: <u>https://www.chooseenergy.com/electricity-rates-by-state/</u>.

In FY21, Washoe County had actual expenditures in the General Fund (100) in Utlities (711010), Waste Removal (711011), Sewer (711018), Water (711019), Water/Sewer (711020), Natural Gas (711040), and Propane (711050) in the amount of \$3,176,453 and for FY22 it is predicted to be \$3,811,169; a 22.2% increase.

Homelessness Fund – Our Place:

On June 15, 2022, a main water break at the Our Place Campus was determined critical for repair. The repair will require all of the water resources to be shut off to the entire lower campus impacting all of the Our Place buildings, JOY, and the childcare center. Repairs are scheduled for Monday, June 20th and will tak 2-3 days to fix. Human Services has an action plan in place for the Our Place Campus during the repair. Due to the anticipated cost and scope of the repair, use of major maintenance capital funding is not an option.

FISCAL IMPACT

If approved, the use of General Fund contingency in account 189000-820000 and the associated cross-fund, cross-functional budget appropriation transfers are anticipated to bring the budget into alignment with actual and/or anticipated expenditures for Fiscal Year 2022 (FY22) for the items outlined above. All adjustments are within the existing approved budget for Washoe County and are summarized in the following table.
