# **SUMMARY**

The Human Services Agency recommends that the Board accept the FY19 Senior Mental Health subaward from the State of Nevada Division of Public and Behavioral Health (DPBH) to provide mental health support for seniors in the amount of [\$75,000; no county match] retroactively from October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019; authorize the Director of the Human Services Agency to execute the grant documents; and direct the Comptroller's Office to make the necessary budget amendments..

Strategic Objective supported by this item: Safe, secure and healthy communities

### PREVIOUS ACTION

On November 28, 2017, item 12, the Board authorized acceptance of the \$75,000 in federal funds, through the DPBH to provide mental health support for seniors.

# BACKGROUND

Retroactive approval is requested as the Agency received the Notice of Sub-Grant Award from the State of Nevada Division of Public and Behavioral Health on December 27, 2018.

The 60+ senior population is the fastest growing age group in Washoe County, projected to reach 100,000 people by 2020. Many seniors live in the unincorporated areas of Washoe County, making socialization, access to services and engagement in programs challenging.

Washoe County Human Services Agency (WCHSA)"s Senior Services Division has experienced a number of incidences that highlight a continued need for mental health services and infrastructure for seniors, specifically the ability to immediately respond to mental health needs of seniors in our community. As the senior population grows WCHSA frequently encounters seniors who have exhibited suicidal thoughts, aggression, agitation, depression, cognitive decline, and substance abuse.

Previously, WCHSA had received grant funding to provide mental health services to seniors from the Aging and Disability Services Division for FY 2006/07 through FY 2009/10. In FY 2017/18, WCHSA received funding to reinstate the mental health services that were discontinued in FY 2009/10 due to grant support ending as a result of the recession.

**Scope of Project:** To provide mental health support for seniors suffering from serious mental illness needing treatment, case management, rehabilitation and other support services to better function in the community.
