<u>RESOLUTION</u> – Authorizing the Grant of Public Monies to a Nonprofit Organization Created for Religious, Charitable or Educational Purposes.

WHEREAS, NRS 244.1505 provides that a Board of County Commissioners may expend money for any purpose which will provide a substantial benefit to the inhabitants of the County and that a board may make a grant of money to a nonprofit organization created for religious, charitable or educational purposes or to a governmental entity to be expended for a selected purpose; and

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners of Washoe County upon the recommendation of Commissioner Bob Lucey for District 2, has determined that \$4,000.00 will be granted to Doral Academy of Northern Nevada (DANN); and

WHEREAS, is dedicated to creating an enhanced and engaging whole-child educational experience, while providing an academically rigorous learning environment with a strong emphasis on problem-based learning, arts integration, and social and emotional development; and

WHEREAS, a collaborative effort, with all students, parents, and staff, will be devoted to establishing, achieving, and celebrating individual goals to prepare every student for college, career, and civic life; and

WHEREAS, as a beacon of educational practice, DANN will foster student efficacy in critical thinking, confident decision-making, creative problem-solving, purposeful collaboration, and leading with kindness and compassion; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, By the Board of Commissioners of Washoe County that:

- 1. The Board hereby grants Doral Academy of Northern Nevada, a grant for fiscal year 2022-2023 in the amount of \$4,000.00.
- 2. The Board finds that in making this grant a substantial benefit will be provided to the residents in Washoe County by preparing every student for college, career, and civic life.
- 3. The funds shall not be used to purchase tickets to special events.
