Vaccination PODS Have Concluded



TMFR continues to hold a series of Saturday COVID-19 vaccine clinics for the public. The vaccine clinic includes the first and second dose of the Moderna vaccine. May 8, the District was able to accommodate the Janssen vaccine which is limited to only one dose. The last vaccine clinic was held Saturday, May 29. On going vaccine PODS are still available through the Health District

Pallet Yard Fire Sun Valley



Firefighters extinguished a significant fire at a pallet yard On April 29. Reno and Sparks Fire Departments, and the Nevada Air National Guard assisted.

The fire was widely visible and consumed stacks of pallets, building and industrial materials, and abandoned vehicles including a bus. Crews contained the fire to the property of origin and no residential structures were lost. No injuries were reported.

Recognition for Cardiac Save



On May 21, Saint Mary's Hospital honored the crew of Engine 44 (Stead) during their first annual "Code Save" Ceremony. Captain Ryan Whitlock, Engineer Brian Haley, Firefighter/Paramedics Brandon Meredith and Bryan Harter saved the life of a patient in cardiac arrest last year.

Water Entry Team (WET) training



Even though river flows are not as high as the previous year's runoff, the whitewater adventure still has its risks. TMFR WET Team members took part in training in May on the Truckee River and at Washoe Lake. The training provided opportunities to get certified and recertified as a member of the team. Programs included locating patients underwater and swift water rescue techniques.

Wildland Training



Throughout May, fire crews participated in comprehensive wildland drills. The drills allowed for refresher training on constructing fire lines, operating brush engine pump systems, assembling dip tanks, deploying fire shelters, and a variety of other suppression tasks.

Final Green Waste of the Spring Season - June 5 & 6





Incident Total for April 2021: 981








