 - **SUBJECT:** Recommendation to accept a grant award from The U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) FY 2023 Law Enforcement Mental Health and Wellness Act Award (LEMHWA), Award No 15JCOPS-23-GG-01836-LEMH [amount not to exceed \$122,268.00, No County match required], to cover costs related to expanding the capabilities of the WCSO Peer Support Team through education and increasing peer support team awareness throughout the WCSO, for the retroactive grant term of October 1, 2023 through September 30, 2025 and if approved, authorize Sheriff Balaam to execute grant award documentation, and direct the Comptroller's Office to make the necessary budget amendments. SUMMARY

This item is presented seeking approval to accept the grant award from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS). Per county policy, the Washoe County Board of County Commissioners must accept grant awards and direct the Comptroller's Office to make the necessary budget amendments.

The U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) awarded the Washoe County Sheriff's Office, Peer Support Team \$122,268.00 via FY 2023 Law Enforcement Mental Health and Wellness Act Award (LEMHWA). The Washoe County Sheriff's Office will utilize this grant to improve the delivery of and access to mental health and wellness services for WCSO employees through expanding the capabilities and awareness of the Peer Support Team.

BACKGROUND

The WCSO Peer Support Team has grown and diversified significantly over the last few years, and currently consists of 59 members from most units and divisions within the WCSO. Therefore, the first goal of this award is to utilize funds to provide core and advanced training to the entire team ensuring (1) high quality consistent practices and (2) the spread of duties and contacts within the team, thus preventing burn-out. A highly trained peer support team will have the ability to identify, support, and provide the appropriate resources to those employees that are in need. Positive interactions with highly trained peer support team members will also be integral in changing the stigma associated with asking for help. Funding to send 5 team leads to the Wellness on the Front Line 2024 Conference in San Diego, will ensure that we are staying abreast of the advancements within this field and create valuable connections within the peer support community. Our second goal is to increase peer support team awareness throughout the WCSO by providing peer support team hosted presentations, peer support inscribed pens to all employees, peer support business cards and peer support inscribed clothing.
