### April 2026 Fire Prevention Statistics

#### **Public Education Events: 10**

These are events such as school visits, educational events, and parades.

#### **Annual and Initial Business License Inspections: 35**

These inspections are regulatory procedures designed to ensure businesses comply with safety, health, and zoning regulations to protect public safety and maintain legal operating standards.

#### **Pre-Development Reviews: 11**

An early-stage high-level assessment of a proposed project by county departments or experts before formal application submission. These types of reviews can help identify issues, reduce risk, identify high-cost requirements and help accelerate formal approvals.

#### **Fire Investigations: 6**

A process of determining the origin, cause, and development of a fire. It involves examining fire scenes, collecting evidence, and analyzing patterns to understand how and why a fire started and how it spread.



### **New Construction Building Reviews: 92**

These reviews are a comprehensive assessment of building plans or on-site work to ensure compliance with safety codes, zoning regulations, and design standards before or during construction.

### **New Construction Inspection: 51**

An official review is conducted to ensure that a newly built building complies with all applicable fire safety codes and regulations before it can be occupied.

### **New Fire and Life Safety Systems Reviews: 24**

These reviews are comprehensive, proactive assessments of building construction documents, fire protection systems, and safety features conducted to ensure compliance with adopted codes (e.g., NFPA, IFC) and standards before construction or modification begins.

### **Training Hours: 9**

Our continued training for a fire inspector and fire investigator focuses on maintaining up-to-date knowledge of fire codes, investigation techniques, and emerging hazards. This includes regular review of standards such as those from the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), updates to building and fire codes, and advancements in fire dynamics and forensic investigation methods. Our ongoing education may involve classroom instruction, field exercises, legal and courtroom procedure training, and certifications. This continuous development ensures we remain proficient in identifying fire risks, determining fire origin and cause, and adapting to new technologies, materials, and safety practices.
