Provide variable message boards at the following locations: west of Village Blvd. on Lakeshore Blvd., east of Country Club Dr. on Lakeshore Blvd. and west of Village Blvd. on Tahoe Blvd. This was on the approved traffic control plan for this event in 2023. Update the traffic control plan to reflect this.
- b. Provide a copy of the NDOT Encroachment Permit for approving traffic control in their right-of-way.

a. General conditions

I. The applicant shall demonstrate substantial conformance to the plans approved as part of this outdoor festival event permit. Planning and Building shall determine compliance with this condition.

b. Pre-event conditions

- I. <u>Prior to July 1, 2025</u>: The applicant will provide the Planning and Building Division with the necessary documentation that all pre-event requirements have been met to obtain an Outdoor Festival Business License.
- II. <u>Prior to July 1, 2025</u>: The applicant shall gain approvals from all applicable agencies including but not limited to: North Lake Fire Protection District (NLTFPD), United States Coast Guard (Lake Tahoe) (USCG); the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA); the Nevada Department of Wildlife (NDOW); and the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency (TRPA).

c. During event conditions

I. Event staff will begin setting up traffic control and other event elements beginning at 5:00 a.m. on July 4, 2025 and the fireworks show will take place approximately between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 9:30 p.m.

d. Post-event conditions

- I. Event staff is allowed to take-down, dismantle, and conduct cleanup efforts between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. on July 5, 2025.
- II. The applicant shall adhere to the conditions of approval placed upon them by the US Coast Guard, Nevada Department of Wildlife, and North Lake Tahoe Fire Protection District, for cleanup related to the fireworks display.
