PROJECT TITLE AND DESCRIPTION PM2.5 MONITORING NETWORK This agreement provides funding to Northern Nevada Public Health Air Quality Management Division (NNPH AQMD) to assist with necessary development, establishment, and maintenance of adequate monitoring programs for the prevention and control of air pollution. This grant is provided to conduct ambient air quality monitoring of fine particulate matter (PM2.5). Specifically, the recipient will collect quality assured PM2.5 concentrations and submit results to EPA's national air quality database. This assistance agreement provides full federal funding in the amount of \$127,598 which includes \$54,728 set-aside for EPA in-kind services. Preaward costs are approved back to 4/1/2025. See terms and conditions. The activities include collecting quality assured PM2.5 concentrations and submitting results to EPA's national air quality database. The anticipated deliverables include quality assured PM2.5 concentrations submitted to EPA's national air quality database. The expected outcomes include reduced PM2.5 concentrations and compliance with the PM2.5 National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) as set forth in the Clean Air Act. The intended beneficiaries include residents of Washoe County who will have decreased risk of adverse health effects. No subawards are included in this assistance agreement.

B.] Cybersecurity Grant Condition for Other Recipients

(a) The recipient agrees that when collecting and managing environmental data under this assistance agreement, it will protect the data by following all applicable State or Tribal law cybersecurity requirements.

(b) (1) EPA must ensure that any connections between the recipient's network or information system and EPA networks used by the recipient to transfer data under this agreement, are secure. For purposes of this Section, a connection is defined as a dedicated persistent interface between an Agency IT system and an external IT system for the purpose of transferring information. Transitory, user-controlled connections such as website browsing are excluded from this definition.

If the recipient's connections as defined above do not go through the Environmental Information Exchange Network or EPA's Central Data Exchange, the recipient agrees to contact the EPA Project Officer (PO) no later than 90 days after the date of this award and work with the designated Regional/Headquarters Information Security Officer to ensure that the connections meet EPA security requirements, including entering into Interconnection Service Agreements as appropriate.
