Security Officers Brandon Samaniego and Staisman Sadang demonstrated bravery in the direct line of fire to move victims to safety and enable swift law enforcement response; and

Whereas,

EMTs Brian Vargus and Kyle Quackenbush immediately rendered life-saving aid, coordinating with REMSA and the Fire Department, while staff members Billy Cooper, Kade Macedo, and Benito Puentes-Rangel shielded guests, contacted emergency services, and directed responders to the shooter; and

these selfless acts are born not of obligation but of compassion and courage, reflecting an instinctive commitment to preserve human life even at personal risk, providing comfort in fear, restoring faith in our shared humanity, and leaving a lasting example of service, sacrifice, and community spirit.
