

# COMPETENCY AND MENTAL HEALTH

- Competency Court
  - Mental Competency cases assigned to Department 7 starting March 2023
  - Official Competency docket established September 2023
  - 34 day decrease in mental competency timelines between January 2023 and December 2023
- Diversionary Efforts
  - 15 individuals diverted from competency process to inpatient treatment at Dini-Townsend.
    - 10 have been discharged to outpatient treatment
  - 6 individuals referred directly to outpatient treatment
  - Only 3 rearrests during this reporting period

## Language Access

- 2,149 hearings/events had an interpreter
  - Up from 1,941 events in 2022 (10% increase)
- Increased accessibility for hybrid hearings.
- Additional equipment purchased to better assist interpreters.
- Lack of local certified interpreters
  - Court hearings require interpreters certified through the Nevada Supreme Court.
  - Alternative interpretation methods used for non-Court hearings.
