## **BACKGROUND**

NDEP acquired new Teledyne T640 particulate matter monitors for their ambient air monitoring network to replace existing Met One BAM-1020 particulate matter monitors. In lieu of retiring and disposing of the air monitoring equipment, NDEP offered to donate the equipment to AQMD for use in Washoe County's ambient air monitoring network. The donated equipment can be used as primary or spare air pollution monitors or broken down into parts for the repair of existing monitoring equipment.
