**SUBJECT:** Reccomendation to accept the Project Grant for a Slip-on Tanker Unit from

the U.S. Department of the Interior in the amount of [\$127,420.00; no County match required] to be used to acquire a slip-on tanker unit for a fleet vehicle assigned to Gerlach Fire. This unit can be quickly converted to be operated as a fire engine, If approved, authorize David Solaro to execute grant award documents on behalf of the Office of the County Manager and direct Finance to make the necessary budget amendments. (All Commission

Districts.)

### **SUMMARY**

The Washoe County Board of County Commissioners must accept grants and approve amendments to the adopted fiscal year budget and direct the Finance Department to make the necessary budget amendments.

This funding is received from the Department of the Interior for a slip-on tanker unit assigned to the Gerlach Fire Station's fleet and is a critical investment in rural fire protection. This unit increases the station's capacity to transport and deploy water quickly, improving the ability to contain wildland fires, protect homes and infrastructure, and safeguard the health and safety of residents and visitors.

#### BACKGROUND

Wildfire activity is increasing. Drought and prolonged, increased temperatures are creating conditions that allow wildfires to start earlier in the year, enable them to last

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longer, and make them more difficult to control. Increasingly intense wildfires and prolonged droughts then lead to an influx of invasive species that burn more easily than antive vegetation and in turn propel still more extreme wildfire activity.

As a result, wildfires are now occurring in places where they were previously extremely rare, with more land burning, on average, each year.

This is leading to a year-round wildfire season, now referred to as a fire year, throughout the country. The frequency of large wildfires is also increasing, particularly near communities.

The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, also known as the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL), enacted in November 2021, is bringing much -needed support to communities across the country to increase the resilience of lands facing the treat of wildland fires and to better support federal wildland firefighters. The BIL provides funding and authorizes DOI to develop and implement a pilot program to provide local governments with financial assistance to acquire slip-on tanker unit that can be quickly converted to be operated as a fire engine.
