PREVIOUS ACTION

On September 10, 2024, the Board of County Commissioners approved item 6.D.3, the Department's request to accept [\$15,000.00; no county match requirement] in Children's Justice Act funds from the State of Nevada Division of Child and Family Services for the period of July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025.

On July 11, 2023, the Board of County Commissioners approved item 4.E.1, the Department's request to accept [\$40,684.00; no county match requirement] in Children's Justice Act funds from the State of Nevada Division of Child and Family Services for the period of July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024.

On July19, 2022, the Board of County Commissioners approved item 7.C.2, the Department's request to accept [\$40,050; no county match requirement] in Children's Justice Act funds from the State of Nevada Division of Child and Family Services retroactive to July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023.

On July 20, 2021, the Board of County Commissioners approved item 8.E.1, the Department's request to accept [\$2,500.00; no county match requirement] in Children's Justice Act funds from the State of Nevada Division of Child and Family Services retroactive to May 1, 2021 through September 30, 2021.

On August 31, 2020, the Board of County Commissioners approved item 5.G.2, the Department's request to accept [\$53,950; no county match requirement] in Children's Justice Act funds from the State of Nevada Division of Child and Family Services retroactive to July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.

BACKGROUND

The State of Nevada Division of Child and Family Services awards federal Children's Justice Act (CJA) funding to assist qualifying agencies in developing, establishing, and operating programs designed to improve the assessment and investigation of suspected child abuse and neglect cases including child sexual abuse and neglect-related fatalities and the assessment and investigation of cases involving children with disabilities or serious health-related problems who are suspected victims of child abuse and/or neglect.

CJA funding has supported HSA with critical training and technology in the past. Highlights for the FY26 CJA funding include Forensic Training, Trauma Informed Leadership to improve response to secondhand trauma among child protection workers, technology for improving the intake and assessment process.
