



# Recommended Awards - August - September 2024

- 1. Identified Projects of Urgent or Emergent Need Maximize Investment
  - Internal County Departments, Community Non-Profits, Other Gov Entities
  - Community Competitive Grantees Amendments Additional Funding
  - New Awards addressing urgent needs and/or Opportunity to Maximize Investment
- 2. Review Potential Projects with WC Leadership
- 3. Review Potential Projects with County Commissioners
  - Gather input, make adjustments, and work with recipients regarding SOW, etc.
- 4. Make Recommendations to Board of County Commissioners
- 5. Initiate award documents, training, technical assistance, monitoring, compliance oversight, financial management and reporting



# SLFRF - New Awards & Amendments (Sept 17, 2024)

- 1. Nation's Finest Veterans Services to support the enhancement of the Health Care for Homeless Veterans (HCHV) residential program by supporting the Veteran Service Officer (VSO) position. \$150,000
- 2. Sun Valley General Improvement District to support recreation projects Including: sealing and striping parking lot, walking paths, and basketball court at Highland Ranch Park & installation of picnic benches & security cameras at Gepford Park. \$60,000
- 3. Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe Gerlach Fire Services in the amount of \$200,000
- **4. Public Defenders Paralegal Program** to support Washoe County Public Defender and the Alternate Public Defender's offices to hire temporary paralegals. \$80,000
- 5. Community Spay & Neuter Project, public high-volume, high-quality spay/neuter program at the Nevada Humane Society (NHS). To perform 5,000 surgeries within the first 12 months, up to 7,000 surgeries the following year \$750,000
- **6.** Rancho San Rafael Community Events Space Phase I, engineering, design, and site prep for an open-air multi-purpose stage and community events space for performances, and educational programs. \$1,000,000
- 7. Recruitment Incentive, to amend the existing award by \$15,000 for a total amount of \$165,000. The Washoe County Recruitment & Retention Incentive Program is used to assist with the recruitment and retention of employees in difficult to fill positions in the County that are impacted by a shortage of qualified labor in the region



# SLFRF - New Awards & Amendments (Reconsidered Sept 17, 2024)

- 1. **Tenancy Support Program** providing case management for tenancy support and a shallow rental assistance subsidy. \$790,000
- 2. Sheriff Office Staffing Study Staffing study to determine the recommended commissioned and civilian staffing needed to create a safe facility for both the staff manning the proposed new 240 bed medical facility and the inmate population. \$89,900
- 3. Community Art and Washoe Artrail digital application to include an interactive augmented experience and the Gerlach trailhead art. \$200,000. The funds will be used to commission and install art pieces in the Washoe County region including but not limited to, the Washoe Artrail, murals, and arts at Washoe County parks
- 4. Seven Magic Mountains Relocation and Install, to support the relocation of the Seven Magic Mountains, large-scale site-specific public art installation from its current location south of the Las Vegas Strip along Interstate 15, to a location in Washoe County by the end of 2026, \$500,000
- 5. Communities in Schools, in support of the expansion of the CIS program into four middle schools. \$238,000
- 6. **Notables Accessibility,** improve accessibility by supporting window coverings, solar panels, ADA compliant doors and furniture to enhance therapeutic experience for all participants in their facility. \$305,000



# SLFRF - New Awards & Amendments (Reconsidered Sept 17, 2024) Continued

- 7. Courage House, to support Courage Worldwide bringing a Courage House to Northern Nevada supporting victims of sex trafficking and offering the most vulnerable children a refuge with trauma and survivor informed residential therapy, award will support purchase of a property in Washoe County where services will be provided. \$250,000
- 8. **Truckee River Rangers**, to expand the consistency of patrols, programming, and citizen engagement along the Truckee River Corridor. \$200,000
- 9. Northern Nevada Literacy Council, to support the continuation of the work of providing literacy programs and career pathways for 40 adult learners ages 16-24 leading to career pathways with sustainable living wages, \$100,000
- **10. Rebuilding Together Northen Nevada,** to support 20 households to be pre-qualified with home repairs and a site feasibility project in Gerlach. \$75,000
- 11. Family Respite Care of Nevada, supporting children residing in Washoe County who are in foster or post-adoption care. \$50,000
- 12. Tahoe Area Regional Transportation, in support of another year of improving alternative transportation options compared to personal vehicles and reducing congestion and improve traffic flow by reducing vehicles on the road. \$400,000





# **Funding Status**

- Opioid Settlement Recovered Funds to be received until approximately 2043
  - ~\$31 million over the next 19 years
- \$7.5 million received from the Attorney General's Office (as of 9/10/2024)

### **Fund Distribution**

- \$4 million awarded on 9/10/2024
- Successful projects funded under this cycle will be eligible for an abbreviated renewal application so long as the projects are consistent with updated priorities in the Needs Assessment and are meeting performance requirements.
- 2026-2029 Needs Assessment to be conducted in mid-2025
- Second funding cycle (10/1/2026 9/30/2029)





# **Community Development Block Grant**

- Awarded FFY2024
  - Gerlach Infrastructure Update Preliminary Engineering Report (PER) \$40,000
    - Complete a PER to include recommendation for the wastewater plant capacity and feasibility
  - Sidehill Dr. Pedestrian ADA Improvements Project \$495,250
    - Remove and replace existing asphalt curb with concrete curb, gutter and sidewalk
- Application Deadline for FFY 25 October 18, 2024
  - Projects awarded July 1, 2025
  - Potential Project Include:
    - Gepford Park Pedestrian Safety
    - · Steamboat Infrastructure
    - Rennervation Facilities
    - Sky Tavern Water & Facilities

## **Discretionary Grant Facilitation & Assistance**

#### **APPLICATIONS AWARDED - FY 2024**

#### 49 applications awarded in 2024

Community Reinvestment activities assisted in the development of alternative funding by providing technical assistance to departments increasing their service delivery in existing and new programs using external grant funds.

Some examples include the following awards:

- increasing community mental health services with the West Hills property purchase and rehabilitation;
- implementation of a Community Forestry program providing tree inventory and maintenance plans;
- Climate and Energy awards increased progress towards Sustainability NetZero goals;
- Sheriff's Office has increased **mental health services to inmates**;
- Justice Courts increased availability of service treatment and recovery to Veterans and Homeless populations;
- Parks has **enhanced access to trail heads** and improved maintenance; and
- Alternative Sentencing enhanced their STAR program reporting great success with participants.
