in 2024, Washoe County experienced 3,710 domestic and elderly crimes, 2,363 violent crimes—including murder, sexual assault, and robbery—and 10,530 property crimes, underscoring the ongoing need for victim support and justice; and

Whereas,

surviving a crime can have lasting effects on victims, including physical, psychological, social, and financial challenges, making comprehensive support services essential for healing and recovery; and

Whereas,

as a community, we have a moral responsibility to support crime victims by creating safe environments, providing access to critical resources, and ensuring they have the opportunity to seek justice and regain hope; and

the Washoe County District Attorney's Office, Washoe County Sheriff's Office, law enforcement, the courts, victim service providers, advocates, and allied professionals play a vital role in upholding victims' rights, enforcing justice, and ensuring survivors receive the support they deserve; and
