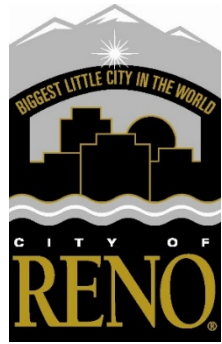

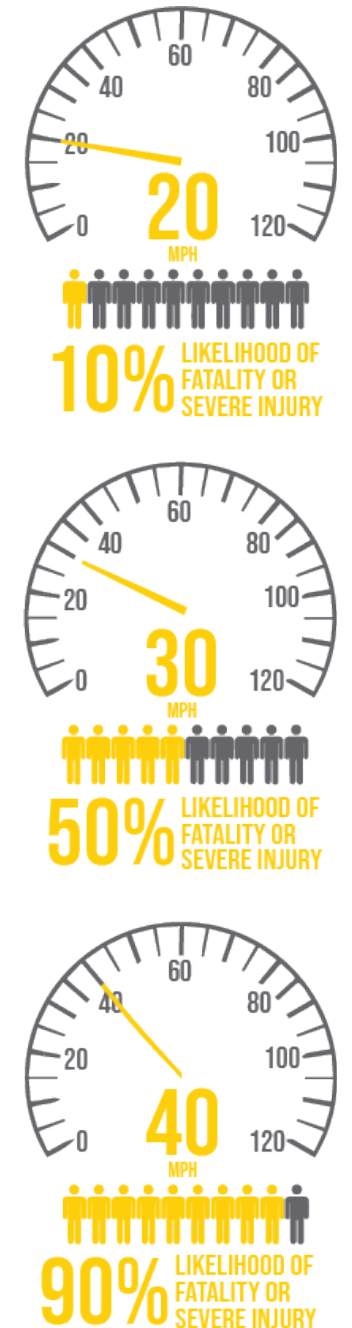
Zero Pedestrian Fatalities by 2030

Action Plan:

- Three components:
 1. Programmatic
 2. Street Design/Infrastructure
 3. Community Engagement/Outreach
- Measurable Outcomes
- Used equitable, data-driven, transparent decisions and actions to improve safety throughout our community

Action Plan Goals

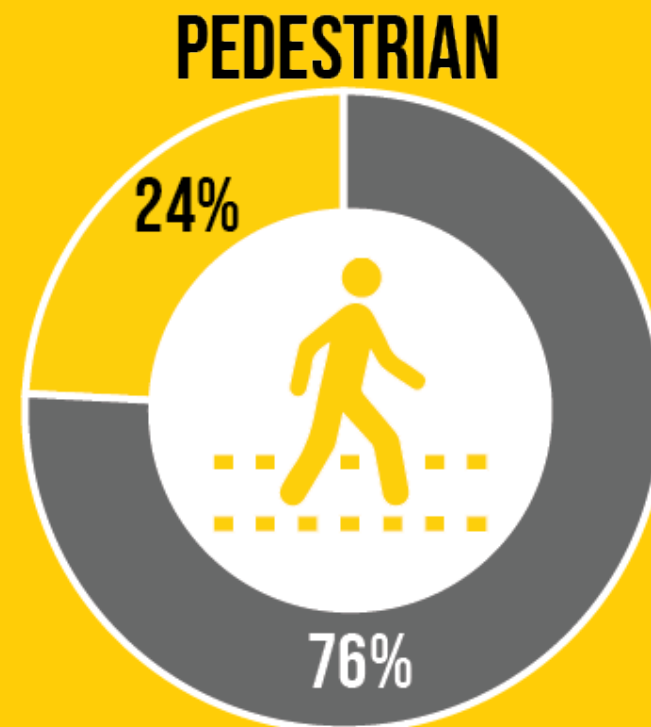
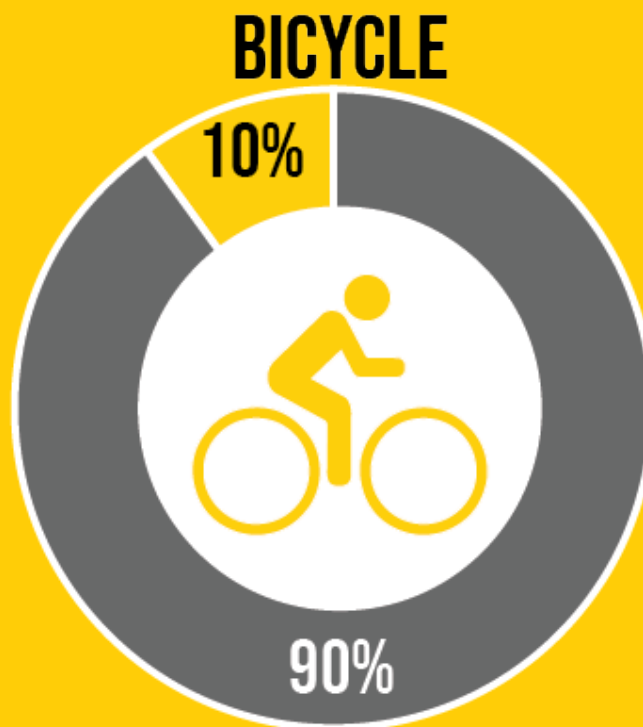
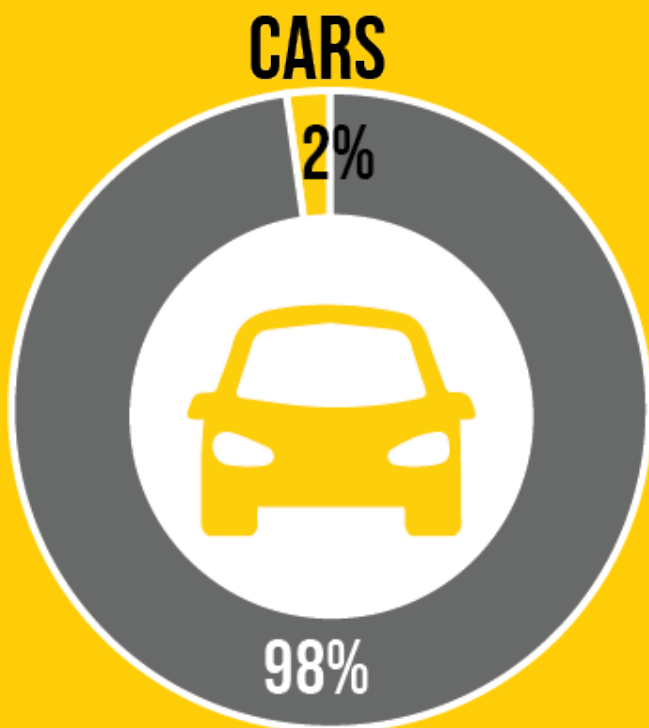
1. Programmatic - Adopt the goal of reaching zero fatalities by 2030
2. Street Design/Infrastructure – Develop a regional lighting standard and enhance street lighting to improve visibility throughout the Truckee Meadows
3. Community Engagement/Outreach – Recommend, pursue and establish Pedestrian Safety Zones

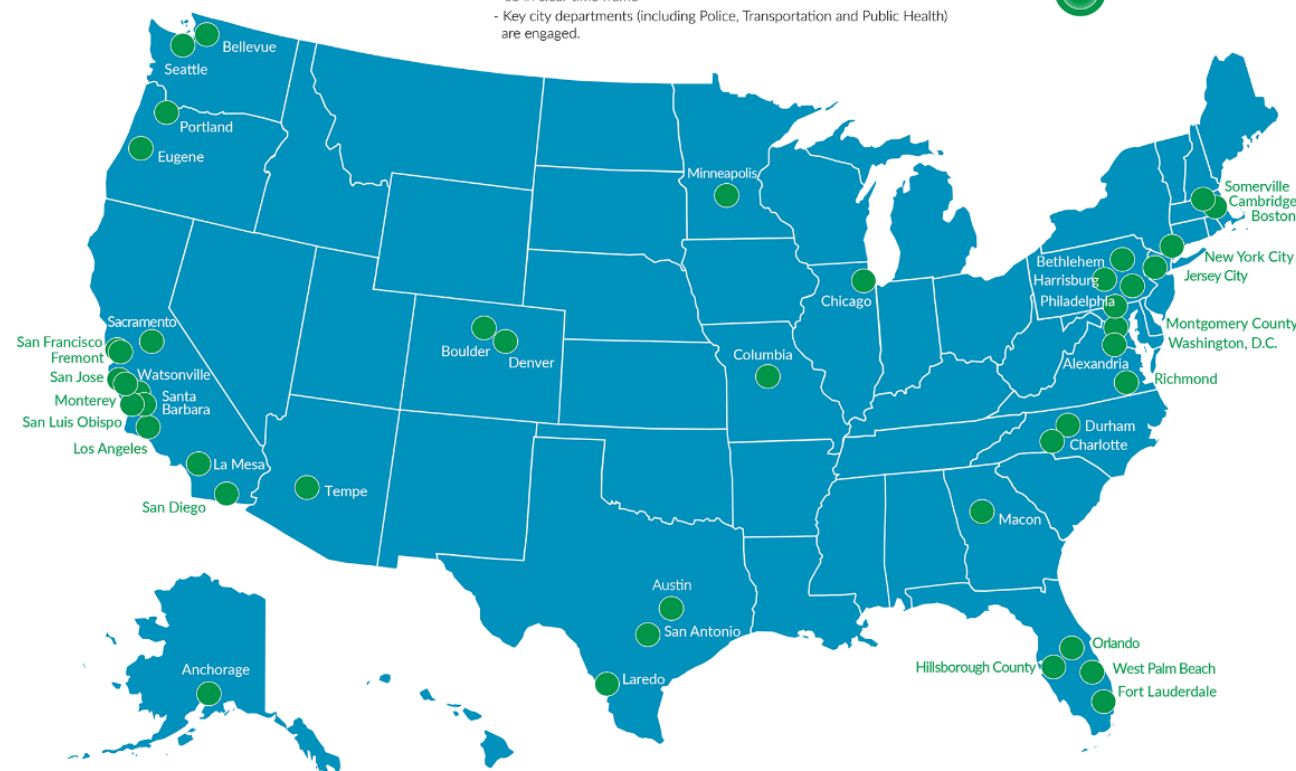

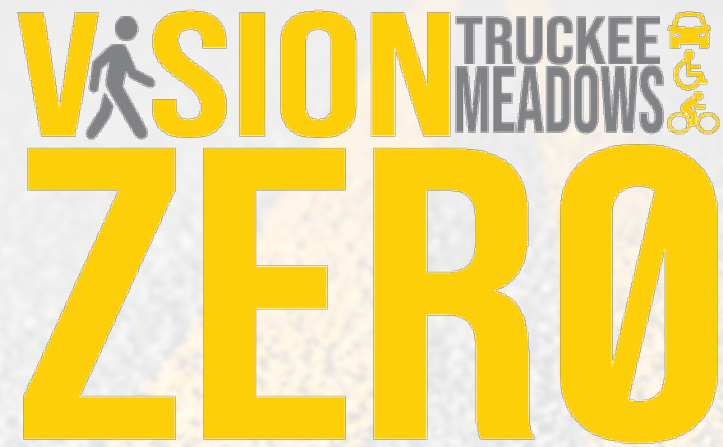
- Submit application

Vision Zero Cities

A Vision Zero City meets the following minimum standards:

- Sets clear goal of eliminating traffic fatalities and severe injuries
- Mayor has publicly, officially committed to Vision Zero
- Vision Zero plan or strategy is in place, or Mayor has committed to doing so in clear time frame
- Key city departments (including Police, Transportation and Public Health) are engaged.
