SUBJECT: Recommendation, in accordance with NRS 244.1505 and NRS 433.742, to

approve allocation of Washoe Opioid Abatement and Recovery Fund (WOARF) non-bankruptcy funds through the One Nevada Agreement, in the total amount of [\$4,009,786], to government entities or nonprofit organizations created for charitable, religious, or educational purposes; approve associated resolutions, and authorize the County Manager to sign necessary award documents, for the following six projects awarded:

- Human Services Agency CrossRoads Families WOARF24-00002 in the amount of [\$1,000,000] to provide therapeutic living community to families impacted by Opioid Use (OUD) to engage in recovery together.
- Northern Nevada HOPES Opioid Treatment Expansion Project
 WOARF24-00007 in the amount of [\$984,002] and approve
 Resolution R24-186. Funding supports establishing a new opioid treatment program at the East 4th Street Clinic.
- Ridge House Inc Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) Outpatient Services WOARF24-00006 in the amount of [\$300,000] and approve Resolution R24-187. Funding supports providing outpatient and aftercare service to uninsured and underinsured Washoe County Residents.
- Northern Nevada Harm Reduction Alliance Building Communities of Support – WOARF24-00001 in the amount of [\$523,403] and approve Resolution R24-188. Funding supports comprehensive harm reduction strategies, community engagement, and policy advocacy, led by the expertise and leadership of individuals with lived experience.
- Join Together Northern Nevada Inc Partnerships for Prevention – WOARF24-00004 in the amount of [\$250,000] and approve Resolution R24-189. Funding supports providing support and resources to bridge transportation and resource gaps

- in Washoe County for individuals who are unhoused and at-risk or in current use of Opioids
- Bristlecone Family Resources Medical Detox Building WOARF24-00003 in the amount of [\$952,381] and approve Resolution R24-190. Funding supports building a medical detox facility.

SUMMARY

The Washoe Opioid Abatement and Recovery Fund (WOARF) through the One Nevada Agreement, provides grant awards for the purpose of abating and recovering from the opioid epidemic in accordance with the Opioid Litigation Settlement Documents Use of Funds, NRS 433.742, and NRS 244.1505.

The Washoe Opioid Abatement and Recovery Fund conducted an open and competitive grant solicitation for projects to address one of the five priorities identified in the Washoe County Opioid Use Community Needs Assessment 2023-2025. The application period was from May 15th, 2024, to June 30th, 2024. The applications were reviewed by a panel consisting of Washoe County staff, subject matter experts, and people with lived experience and considered for the proposal's alignment with the Needs Assessment Priority, sustainability, and populations the project seeks to serve. Applications were presented to Washoe County leadership. The recommended set of awards includes 6 projects totaling \$4,009,786 to local nonprofits and government entities.

The Board of County Commissioners should accept these proposed projects, approve amendments to the adopted fiscal year budget, and direct the Comptroller's Office to make the necessary budget amendments.

<u>Washoe County Strategic Objective supported by this item:</u> Vulnerable Populations, and Innovative Services

PREVIOUS ACTION

August 20, 2024 – The Washoe Opioid Abatement and Recovery Fund has received \$6,933,405.05 in distributions from the Opioid Litigation Settlements in accordance with the One Nevada Agreement since August 23, 2022.

July 16, 2024 – the Board approved the Settlement between Kroger and the State of Nevada is in an amount of \$26,718,162 before attorney's fees are deducted and paid over

a 10-year period. Pursuant to the One Nevada Agreement, Washoe County will receive an estimated annual allocation of \$100,043.47 for 10 years.

January 23, 2024, - the Board approved the creation of one new full-time Grants and Community Program Analyst position, pay grade 16 (Office of the County Manager), upon evaluation and approval by the Job Evaluation Committee (JEC); and authorize Human Resources to make the necessary changes; 100% funded by Opioid Settlement funds [Estimated annual costs \$125,687; Fiscal Year 2024 impact \$62,844].

November 14, 2023 – the Board approved the Settlement between the State of Nevada and Masters Pharmaceutical, LLC in the amount of \$1,428,552.26 before attorney's fees. Pursuant to the One Nevada Agreement, Washoe County will receive an estimated total net allocation of \$54,819.67.

BACKGROUND

Washoe County collaborated with the State of Nevada and other jurisdictions across the State to litigate against pharmaceutical companies and other distributors of opioids that participated in the opioid epidemic. Through this partnership, under the One Nevada Agreement, Washoe County will receive approximately \$41 million over the next 20 years to address the opioid epidemic through evidence-based, strategic initiatives in alignment with community needs and SB 390. The funds received are to be recognized as funds received from pharmaceutical organizations that have filed bankruptcy and those that have not filed bankruptcy and will be disbursed through the Washoe Opioid Abatement and Recover Fund (WOARF) managed by the Office of the County Manager, Community Reinvestment Division. As of May 15, 2024, when the Notice of Funding Opportunity was announced, Washoe County had received \$4,747,618.72.

In 2022, Washoe County completed a Needs Assessment to provide guidance to the County on the opioid abatement and recovery priorities for 2023-2025. The Needs Assessment identified <u>five priority goals</u>. On May 15, 2024, a Notice of Funding Opportunity was opened to provide competitive grant award for up to 4.5 million dollars from WOARF to implement strategies associated with the Top 5 Priority Areas in the Needs Assessment and in-line with the opioid settlement's use of funds strategies, which dictate the dollars must be used for OUD and the impacts of opioid misuse.

Priority Uses of the Funds:

- Ensure funding for opioid use disorder treatment services for uninsured and underinsured Washoe county residents.
- Initiating buprenorphine in the emergency department, as well as during inpatient hospital stays, and care navigators to assist with setting up outpatient resources for continued care and management.

- Use a multidisciplinary approach to providing overdose prevention outreach and education, inclusive of under resourced communities, such as Black Indigenous and People of Color communities, in a culturally and linguistically appropriate manner (organizations, media, churches).
- Implement child welfare best practices for supporting families impacted by substance use.
- Increase detoxification and short-term rehabilitation program capacity.

Washoe Opioid Abatement and Recovery Fund

The Washoe Opioid Abatement and Recovery Fund offers funding to eligible County departments and agencies, nonprofits, and businesses that provide services in Washoe County that are aligned with the County Needs Assessment and in accordance with Opioid Litigation Settlement Documents Use of Funds and NRS 433.742. The County requested proposals for projects or programs to help the community recover from and abate the opioid epidemic, aligned with the priorities of the County Needs Assessment, and further the County's strategic goals.

Expenditure of public money - NRS 244.1505 provides that the Washoe County Board of County Commissioners may expend money for any purpose which will provide a substantial benefit to the inhabitants of the County and that the board may make a grant of money to a nonprofit organization created for religious, charitable, or educational purposes, or other governmental entity, to be expended for a selected purpose.

FISCAL IMPACT

The total fiscal impact of this allocation is \$4,009,786.

Should the board approve the award of WOARF non-bankruptcy funds, an estimated \$4,751,465 is remaining in FY24 WOARF funds to be carried-forward into FY25 via the year-end process (Fund 270, Fund Center 270-9, Cost Center 270910). Once carryforward is complete, the FY25 budget will be adjusted with the following crossfunctional net-zero appropriation transfers:
