- ▶ Welfare of inmates in custody include these factors:
  - ► Health of inmates
  - Access to medical care
  - Infectious disease and vermin control
  - ► Food services
  - ► Environmental controls
  - ► Safety of inmates
  - ► Out of cell time


- ► Partnership with No NV HOPES a success so far
- ► 251 inmates had active Medicaid and EBT services upon release
- ▶ 350 referrals to Northern Nevada HOPES since April 2018
- ► HOPES Release Program enhancement in October: van picks up inmates requesting their services upon release
- ▶ 31 inmates were transferred to HOPES Release Program in October

- Working with NaphCare to develop a medicated assisted treatment (MAT) program
- MAT program will establish protocols for treating inmates with opioid, alcohol, and other withdrawal symptoms
- MAT program will also offer continued care for successful candidates for drug treatment

- ▶ Jail continues to see increase in arrestees with mental illness, homelessness, and drug addiction
- ► Staff continuously works with Reno & Sparks to increase available resources for inmates
- Establishing "warm hand-offs" from the jail to beneficial services in the community

### **Booking Data**


- Arrestees are now spending less time in intake since implementation of Risk Assessment and Bail procedure
- ▶ 84% increase in inmates moved from intake to Housing on same day they are arrested



#### Inmate Average Daily Population

- Summer months traditionally result in higher jail populations and arrests
- ► Fall's special events bring an increase in nuisance-type arrests from downtown area
- Overall downtrend is seen when weather cools
- ► This quarter saw an ADP in July of 1157, an increase over the historical average for July
- August showed a significant increase over historical average, at 1174
- September then decreased

## **Average Daily Population**




## Inmate Booking Types

- Types of inmates booked and housed remain flat from prior reports
- No significant trends relative to the types of arrestees
- Average length of stay has not changed significantly

### Inmate Bookings Increase

- Recent increase in bookings by fiscal year
- From CY14 through CY15, the number trended down gradually
- ► In CY 16, the number grew on a steeper trajectory
- Increase in crime or addition of police officers on the streets will cause this number to increase
- CY 17 ends at 21,367 total bookings, compared to a high in CY 07 of 27,779
