PREVIOUS ACTION

This item has been a standing item on the Board of Fire Commissioners Agenda, with general direction to staff to review and identify bills that can affect the District in part or as a whole and bring back items that may need the Boards direction and backing.

BACKGROUND

Staff seeks direction from the Board regarding AB-102.

Existing law provides that any person who willfully commits certain crimes because of the fact the victim is a first responder, which is defined as any peace officer, firefighter or emergency medical provider acting in the normal course of duty, may, in addition to the term of imprisonment prescribed by statute for the crime, be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for a minimum term of not less than 1 year and a maximum term of not more than 20 years. (NRS 193.1677). This bill extends this enhanced criminal penalty to such crimes committed against the spouse of a first responder or the child of any age of a first responder.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact at this time. Any direction given by the Board that will result in a fiscal impact will be brought back to the board for authorization.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends support of this legislation.
