FIRST AMENDMENT

CHILD WELFARE COLLABORATION AGREEMENT

Pursuant to Section 2.2 of their January 1, 2018 Child Welfare Collaboration Agreement (Agreement), Casey Family Programs (CFP) and Washoe County, Nevada Department of Social Services (DSS), enter into this First Amendment to the Agreement, effective January 1, 2019 (First Amendment). The Parties agree as follows:

- 1. 2019 Strategy and Identified Outcomes Plan. In 2019, the Parties shall undertake the Strategies in the 2019 Strategy and Identified Outcomes Plan detailed in <u>Attachment 2</u>, which is hereby incorporated to the Agreement. Throughout the Term of the Agreement, the Collaboration Leads shall document the Work Efforts and Collaboration Strategies in the Work Plan. On a quarterly basis, the Parties shall evaluate and document the progress and impact of the Collaboration Strategies and Work Efforts according to the reporting schedule in <u>Attachment 2</u>.
- 2. Agreement otherwise in full force and effect. Except as specifically set forth herein, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement remain in full force and effect.
