WHEREAS, NRS 244.1505 provides that a Board of County Commissioners may expend money for any purpose which will provide a substantial benefit to the inhabitants of the County and that a board may make a grant of money to a nonprofit organization created for religious, charitable or educational purposes or to a governmental entity to be expended for a selected purpose; and

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners of Washoe County upon the recommendation of Commissioner Masha Berkbigler for District 1, has determined that \$11,200 will be granted to the Incline Village General Improvement District (IVGID) to purchase eight animal resistant trash and recycle containers along Lakeshore Boulevard; and

WHEREAS, IVGID is a quasi-public agency chartered to provide water, sewer, trash and recreation services for the communities of Incline Village and Crystal Bay; and

WHEREAS, IVGID is empowered to determine what facilities and services it should offer that will preserve or enhance the general health, safety and welfare of the community; and

WHEREAS, Lakeshore Boulevard in Incline Village is in need of animal resistant trash and recycle containers to maintain the beauty of this path day to day; and

WHEREAS, the most important way to minimize human-bear conflicts is to keep garbage away from bears and keep the public safe; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, By the Board of Commissioners of Washoe County that:

- 1. The Board hereby grants to IVGID funds to support the purchase of eight animal resistant trash and recycling containers, a grant for fiscal year 2019-2020 in the amount of \$11,200.
- 2. The Board finds that in making this grant a substantial benefit will be provided to the residents in Washoe County by minimizing human-bear conflicts and maintaining the cleanliness of Lakeshore Boulevard.
- 3. The funds shall not be used to purchase of tickets to special events.
