# **SUMMARY**

The receipt of grant awards requires acceptance by the Board of County Commissioners. HSA is requesting the Board accept a \$14,200.00 grant from the Division of Child & Family Services (DCFS) to support a public service media campaign with a focus on awareness and promotion of infant safe sleep habits.

County Priority/Goal supported by this item: Safe Secure and Healthy Communities

### **PREVIOUS ACTION**

On November 12, 2019, item #8.E.3, the Board of County Commissioners approved the Department's request to accept a subaward from the State of Nevada Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Child & Family Services in the amount of [\$8,590; no County match] retroactively from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020 to provide public awareness and education on youth suicide

On October 13, 2015, item #5.G.1, the Board of County Commissioners approved the Department's request to accept \$3,960 in Child Abuse and Neglect (CANS) grant funding for cribs to support the Safe Sleep Initiative from the Child Death Review Committee's Public Awareness Funding through the Department of Health and Human Services' Division of Child & Family Services retroactively from July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016.

#### **BACKGROUND**

In 1993, the Nevada Child Death Review (CDR) program was established. In 2003, a fee on death certificates was established to collect funding to support child fatality review. The purpose of the Nevada CDR Program is prevention, education, and case analysis to determine needed policy, protocol and statute changes.

Washoe County Human Services has been awarded funding for public awareness campaigning as part of the prevention and education initiative supported by the Child Death Review Fees.

The Department received the Notice of Award for this grant on September 2, 2020 with an effective date of July 1, 2020; therefore, the request to accept this award is retroactive.

#### **GRANT AWARD SUMMARY**

**Project/Program Name:** Infant Safe Sleep Awareness and Promotion Campaign

**Scope of the Project:** To raise public awareness and education related to safe sleep habits for infants, with an emphasis on younger parents (under age 25).

**Benefit to Washoe County Residents:** These funds will benefit Washoe County residents by providing important messages around the promotion of infant safe sleep habits utilizing a variety of outdoor advertising, television and social media platforms.

**On-Going Program Support:** While there is no required continued support, the PSA and artwork created will be maintained by HSA and can continue to be used for awareness and prevention.

**Award Amount:** \$14,200 (\$14,200 Direct/ \$0 Indirect)

**Grant Period:** July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021

**Funding Source:** Department of Health and Human Services
