

## Incidents of Interest

### Tamarack Fire



In July and into August, TMFR provided numerous resources to include a dozer and personnel on a brush engine to help support the Tamarack Fire that started in California and spread into Douglas County, Nevada.

### Mount Rose Crew

The Wildland and Fuels Division is now equipped with three Type 5 Engines.

Supported by NV Energy, the Type 5 Engines are used for initial wildland fire attack. The vehicles also serve as the crew's utility vehicles on fuels reduction work to include in sometimes hard-to-reach areas.



### Flag raising ceremony for BC Hyde (ret.)

On August 25, the TMFR Family came together to honor the life of retired Battalion Chief Al Hyde (1964-2021) with a flag-raising ceremony at Station 33 (Foothill Rd). His family was also in attendance.

Al served with the Nevada Division of Forestry and Sierra Fire prior to his service at TMFR. He was a seasoned fire service veteran and the "cool head" that you wanted on any fire when the incident became difficult. More importantly, he was a great friend and mentor to many firefighters.





## Incidents of Interest



### Whites Fire in Galena Forest

The Whites Fire is one of at least three fires in the Galena Forest area so far this season on August 13. The fire, occurred just about the upper Galena Trailhead n TM jurisdiction, and was mapped at .66 acres, and is under investigation. Crews remained on the fire overnight and embarked on extensive mop-up to ensure the fire was cold and out.



### Plane crash east of Reno

On August 9, a single-engine aircraft crash-landed in TM's jurisdiction. The three occupants escaped safely and hiked from the crash site a few miles into civilian areas. TMFR crews accessed the aircraft to ensure it was not a fire or hazard threat.




### Recruitments

Our crews have been active over the last several weeks supporting HR in participating in firefighter skill assessments and physical agility tests as we look to fill firefighter positions.



## Incident Total for July 2021: 1075







### Good Intent Detail : 215




### Fire Detail: 62
