 - **SUBJECT:** Recommendation to accept a FY22 Fund to Assist Former Foster Youth (FAFFY program) subgrant award from the State of Nevada Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Division of Child and Family Services (DCFS) in the amount of [\$200,000; no county match] retroactive from July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022 to provide case management and related services to youth aging out of foster care; to provide non-county employee travel for youth travel to support permanent connections, normalcy activities, attaining a permanent living situation and other travel needs; authorize the Director of the Human Services Agency to execute the grant award; and direct the Comptroller's office to make the necessary budget amendments. (All Commission Districts)

SUMMARY

The Washoe Board of County Commissioners must accept grant awards. The Agency would like to recommend the acceptance of the FY22 FAFFY program subgrant award from DCFS in the amount of [\$200,000; no county match] retroactive for the period of July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022 to provide case management and related service delivery to youth aging out of foster care.

Nevada provides financial assistance to former foster youth through the passage of Assembly Bill 94, also known as the Financial Assistance to Former Foster Youth Program (FAFFY program). The purpose of the FAFFY program is to assist former foster youth in Nevada ages 18 to 21 in attaining economic self-sufficiency. Youth who are 17.5 years of age and will be leaving foster care at age 18 are also eligible for services to assist with transitioning into adulthood upon leaving foster care.

Washoe County Strategic Objective supported by this item: Safe, Secure and Healthy Communities

PREVIOUS ACTION

On September 8, 2020, the Board of County Commissioners approved item #7, the Agency's request to accept \$190,000 in FAFFY fund from the State of Nevada, Division of Child and Family Services retroactively from July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021.

On August 27, 2019, the Board of County Commissioners approved item #18, the Department's request to accept \$200,000 in FAFFY funds from the State of Nevada, Division of Child and Family Services retroactively from July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020.

On November 13, 2018, the Board of County Commissioners approved item #21, the Department's request to accept \$185,000 in FAFFY funds from the State of Nevada, Division of Child and Family Services retroactively from July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019.

On August 8, 2017, the Board of County Commissioners approved item #24 the Department's request to accept \$250,000 in FAFFY funds from the State of Nevada, Division of Child and Family Services retroactively from July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018.

On August 23, 2016, the Board of County Commissioners approved item #11 the Department's request to accept \$250,000 in FAFFY funds from the State of Nevada, Division of Child and Family Services retroactively from July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017.

The Board has accepted an additional \$1,202,700 in FAFFY Grant Program awards on behalf of the Human Services Agency since 2010.

BACKGROUND

Assembly Bill 94, passed by the 2001 Legislature, authorized County Recorders to charge an additional fee to assist persons making the transition from foster care to independent living. These funds are forwarded to the State Division of Child and Family Services to grant to child welfare agencies. The local child welfare agency must disburse the funds on behalf of qualifying persons, based on need, to obtain goods and services, including job training, housing assistance, medical insurance and those items that will assist the youth in successfully transitioning to self-sufficiency. The Agency can provide the good and services directly or through a contract with a non-profit community organization. Previously, the Agency had a contract with the Children's Cabinet to assist in the coordination and disbursement of services. This contract ended September 30, 2018. As of October 1, 2019, the Human Services Agency has managed these services within the Agency.

The Agency received the Notice of Award for this sub-grant on July 23, 2021 with an effective date of July 1, 2021; therefore, the request to accept this award is retroactive.
