Having been in government budgeting and management in northern Nevada for over 20 years, I was very interested to read your brochure for the vacancy of Washoe County Manager.

Most recently, I have been the Director of Administration for the Regional Transportation Commission (RTC) of Washoe County, a special purpose county-level agency that provides transportation master planning, transit services, and regional road construction to the communities in the Truckee Meadows. As such, I understand the regional perspective that a County Manager would need in guiding services and forging collaborative relationships with partner entities. As Director of Administration, I have led people-centered studies, such as a culture study of the RTC with focus on effectiveness of senior management. Additionally, I led a compensation and classification study, something that has not been done at RTC for 10 years. A main focus of my work is ensuring that RTC employees feel valued and listened to, and I hope to have a chance to tell you how I do that, and what steps I would take to improve communication and morale at Washoe County.

I also have a grounding in public sector budgeting and leadership from my previous positions. As Director of Administration for the State of Nevada, I oversaw a 550-employee organization with an operating budget of approximately \$180 million per fiscal year, as well as a \$400 million capital improvement program via the State Public Works Division. Additionally, that position is where I gained valuable labor relations experience. Previous to the 2019 Legislature, state workers had never had collective bargaining rights, and I was on the team that conducted the first labor negotiations with four different unions.

Prior to serving on the Governor's cabinet, I held various budget analysis and human services roles in both the legislative and executive branches of Nevada state government.

As a result, I am very familiar with the tradeoffs decision makers face when revenues do not meet projections, and difficult choices that must be made about levels of government services.

Washoe County appears to be at a crossroads with this recruitment, and I think I can provide the kind of ethical, collaborative leadership that will help the Board of County Commissioners, the staff, and outside stakeholders move forward with more comity.
