• The team collaborated with the NNPH Communications Team to develop public-facing social media content and press release materials to notify the community of a large-scale infant formula recall associated with potential botulism risk.

Food Safety Plan Review

- Office hours every Tuesday in November have been utilized by potential food establishment operators from the Rock Church, Rocket Ramen, potential commissary kitchen, Ryan's Saloon, Stellar's lounge & grill, Yuzu Sushi, Book bar, and Kam Foods. These potential operators were meeting to inquire about construction and opening requirements for food establishments.
- The team has been busy with food establishment change of ownerships in November for all three Popeyes restaurants, three Dunkin Donuts facilities, two NV Taco Grill restaurants, Beefys restaurant, Hobey's Casino, Good Days Café (old Laughing Planet), Ryan's Saloon, and Jack's Café.

Temp Foods / Special Events / Mobile Foods

- Large events in November included the Riverside Farmers Market Holiday Bazaar held at Idlewild Park and Fantasies in Chocolate held at the Grand Sierra Resort.
 - The Riverside Farmers Market had nearly 60 vendors that were selling food or beverage. While inspections were not required for all vendors, they were all vetted by our team beforehand to ensure their food came from an approved source (establishment with an active health permit or cottage food registration, or Producer Certificate issued by the Nevada Department of Agriculture). This event was so large that a Promoter Permit was required to ensure adequate resources such as restrooms, and solid and liquid waste removal.

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o Fantasies in Chocolate is a benefit for local non-profit organizations and had 28 permitted food and beverage vendors.

Food Operations Enforcement and Investigations:

Permit Suspensions

Ongoing enforcement activities related to continued non-permitted food operations throughout Reno, Sparks and unincorporated Washoe County. Staff continue to partner with other agencies regarding these complaints.

A. Little Caesars Pizza, H20-0396FOOD, 951 W Moana Ln, Reno, NV

The permit was suspended on 11/19/2025 after a routine inspection found sewage backing up into the kitchen under the three-compartment sink. The facility was required to hire a plumber to clear/repair the line and ensure all sewer lines were properly flowing. The permit was reinstated later the same day after repairs were verified by staff.

B. Taco T, H19-0160FOOD, 3466 Lakeside Dr, Reno, NV

The health permit was suspended on 11/6/2025 for repeat consecutive critical violations for storing raw over ready-to-eat foods and cold holding violations. The operator was required to write AMC policies and attend an office hearing prior to permit reinstatement. On 11/7/2025, the office hearing was held and the AMC policies accepted, and the permit was reinstated. The operator subsequently passed reinspection on 11/13/2025.

C. Chemas Real Taco, H19-1069FOOD, 1845 Prater Way, Sparks, NV

The health permit was suspended for repeat critical violation for proper date marking on 11/4/2025 after it was found out of compliance for the fourth time. The operator was required to attend an office hearing and submit an updated AMC policy for date marking. The office hearing was held on 11/5/2025, and the AMC policy was not completed. The operator was provided with templates and provided additional guidance for developing the policy. An updated and complete AMC policy was provided on 11/6/2025 which was accepted and the permit was reinstated. The operator passed a subsequent facility reinspection on 11/18/2025.

D. Golden Boy Mariscos and Sushi, H23-0553FOOD, 1845 Prater Way, Sparks, NV Permit was suspended for lack of a permitted servicing area on 11/05/2025. The operator was found operating on 11/05/2025 on a suspended permit and the prepared food on the mobile unit was discarded. The permit was reinstated on 11/18/2025.

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E. Pillulles Tacos Las Famosos #1 and #2, H23-0454FOOD and H25-0311FOOD, 2100 Victorian Ave, Sparks. NV

The mobile units were found not utilizing the approved servicing area and their permits were suspended on 11/06/2025. Reinspections were completed at the approved servicing area at Millennium Concert Venue on 11/10/2025 and the permits were reinstated for both units.

F. La' Mint, 770 South Meadows Pkwy, Reno, NV

A routine inspection was conducted on 11/5/2025 repeat critical violations for date marking and cold holding. The permit was suspended pending the development of AMC policies and attending an office hearing. The office hearing was held on 11/6/2025 where policies and active managerial control of the restaurant were discussed. After the hearing, a reinspection was conducted on 11/06/2025 where the permit was reinstated.

Permitted Facilities

Commercial Plans / Development Reviews

- Commercial Plans are still continuing to decrease, although in the last three months staff have seen an increase of commercial plans by an average of 28% and a year over year decrease of 11%
- EHS received 215 Commercial Plans to review and conducted 173 EHS specific environmental reviews on those plans during the month of November.
 - EHS has received a total of 1,517 commercial plans for review with a total of 2,198 EHS specific reviews completed.
- 96% of all plans in October 2025 were reviewed within the regional goal of 14 days.
 - o 7 plans of the 178 submitted in October did not meet the regional goal for review.

Environmental Protection

Residential Septic & Well Plan Reviews

- Intake for residential well and septic plans saw a surprising uptick in November. A total of 71 plans came in, 44 of which were new submittals, compared to 46 in 2024 with 23 being new submittals.
- A project to recover septic and well records from the Washoe Regional Mapping System and combine them with NNPH records began in November. When completed, this project will result in all septic and well records being stored in a single place with a standardized naming convention. Longer term, this will allow for the public records requests for these records, a very high-volume activity, to no longer be necessary, as the records will be able to be made available to the public.
- A new inspection checklist for test trench inspections was created during November and demonstrated for the team. The checklist is still in production but would move the team towards digital inspections and away from the current paper system saving time and improving consistency and efficiency.
- The team continues the search for a source for sand filters. In November, a new source was found but was still in the process of being permitted in Lyon County. Team leadership wrote a letter of support to hopefully allow for a temporary permit for the source to produce sand for the backlog of sand filter projects within Washoe County. No response was received as of early December.

Safe Drinking Water

- Two sanitary surveys and one water hauler inspection were completed in the month of November. One sanitary survey remains for the year.
- The team received a grant from the State for conducting PFAS sampling at residential wells. The team was aware the project was incoming and had started discussions but with the grant being approved in November, real work on the project can begin. The project will start with the development of outreach to the public to inform them of the opportunity. Team member Josh Philpott will be leading the project.

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• Team leadership conducted a training session on public water systems which is revisited every few years for new staff coming into the division and to refresh all EHS staff regarding permitted facilities that were served by public water systems other than TMWA. This awareness helps keep lists and Accela updated so that in the event of water emergencies – out of water, boil water notices, etc. – it is easier to respond. A spreadsheet that includes all permitted facilities and their water systems was made available on the EHS SharePoint site and Accela also has notices in each permit.

Waste Management / Underground Storage Tanks (USTs)

- UST staff inspected 13 fuel sites and 7 compliance document review re-inspections in November.
- Staff received 14 complaints for the month of October and conducted 24 on-site inspections.
- Solid Waste Management staff inspected 21 permitted waste management facilities / liquid waste trucks and conducted one (1) re-inspection. One change of ownership for a waste management permit occurred during the month.
- The Senior recruitment was posted on November 14th. The posting will close on December 5th with interviews likely occurring in early January.
