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**SUBJECT:** Recommendation to approve a FFY 2022 Department of Homeland Security

(DHS) grant passed through the State and Local Cybersecurity Grant Program (SLCGP) from the State of Nevada, Division of Emergency Management (NDEM) awarding [\$27,931.00, no County match required], to purchase an add-on module for Cortex XDR, a threat detection software. Grant term is retroactive from April 18, 2024, through November 30, 2025. If approved, authorize the County Manager or his designee to sign the grant award documents when received; and direct the Comptroller's Office to make the necessary budget amendments. ## **SUMMARY**

This item recommends that the Washoe County Board of County Commissioners (the board) approve a FFY 2022 DHS grant passed through the SLCGP from the NDEM to purchase an add-on module for Cortex XDR, a threat detection software awarding [\$27,931.00, no County match required]. Grant term is retroactive to April 18, 2024, through November 30, 2025.

The State and Local Cybersecurity Grant Program (SLCGP) grant is used to fund cybersecurity efforts to improve resiliency across the nation. The State of Nevada, Division of Emergency Management has received this grant for the first time, as this is the inaugural funding year.

This grant is retroactive due to the delay of the US Department of Homeland Security releasing the funds to the Nevada Division of Emergency Management.

Washoe County Strategic Objective supported by this item: Economic Impacts Support a thriving community.

#### PREVIOUS ACTION

The State and Local Cybersecurity Grant Program is new, and the board has not approved this grant before.

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#### **BACKGROUND**

This FFY 2022 Department of Homeland Security (DHS) State and Local Cybersecurity Grant Program (SLCGP) grant is a new initiative set forth by DHS. The potential consequences of cyber incidents threaten national security. Strengthening cybersecurity practices and resilience of state, local, and territorial (SLT) governments is an important homeland security mission and the primary focus of the State and Local Cybersecurity Grant Program (SLCGP). The SLCGP enables DHS to make targeted cybersecurity investments in SLT government agencies, thus improving the security of critical infrastructure and improving the resilience of the services SLT governments provide their community.

The FFY 2022 SLCGP aligns with the 2020-2024 DHS Strategic Plan by helping DHS achieve Goal 3: Secure Cyberspace and Critical Infrastructure, Objective 3.3. Assess and Counter Evolving Cybersecurity Risks. The FY 2022 SLCGP also supports the 2022-2026 FEMA Strategic Plan which outlines a bold vision and three ambitious goals, including Goal 3: Promote and Sustain a Ready FEMA and Prepared Nation, Objective 3.2: Posture FEMA to meet current and emergent threats.

The Cortex XDR project supports the Nevada Commission on Homeland Security priorities and goals. This project directly relates to Objective 3: Implement security protections commensurate with risk. As a governmental organization, Washoe County must adhere to and comply with Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) Chapter 603A.210. In this policy, it is stated that governmental organizations must "comply with the current version of the Center for Internet Security (CIS) Controls as published by the Center for Internet Security, Inc." Specifically, in the CIS Controls, numerous safeguards relate to security measures such as software inventory, access control, and the use of continuous vulnerability management tools (CIS Controls 2, 6, and 7, respectively. Currently, Washoe County uses Cortex XDR to conduct threat investigation and prevention across endpoints and networks. However, with the host insights add-on module, the team will have extended endpoint visibility, with the ability to find and remove malicious files promptly, provide visibility to quickly identify threats, and improve vulnerability management with Common Vulnerabilities and Exposure (CVE) metrics. This change will affect all county endpoints and networks, including rural communities.

This grant requires no match.
