Background

- On Sep 16, 2024, the DBOH adopted revisions to Chapter 030 (General Source Permitting).
- Sections in Chapter 030 pertaining to Asbestos were removed and will be relocated to Chapter 040 (Prohibited Emissions).
- Sections pertaining to asbestos have not been reviewed or revised in 25 to 30 years.







Major Changes

- Separated the rules into two Parts:
 - 040.110 Asbestos Control Standards
 - 040.115 Acknowledgement of Asbestos Assessment (AAA)
- Added definitions to each Part to increase clarity.
- Added specific recordkeeping requirements.
- Added a clear list of exemptions and exceptions.
- More organized structure of information.





Structure

Part 040.110 – Asbestos Control Standards

Provides additional clarity to the federal requirements for

Asbestos and defines implementation of the rule.

Part 040.115 – Acknowledgement of Asbestos Assessment (AAA)

Provides additional clarity to the local requirements for

AAA's associated with renovation and demolition projects.



Part 040.110 (Proposed Revision)

Asbestos Control Standards

- Establishes Standard Work Practices.
- Clarifies requirements for Alternative Work Plans.
- Includes survey, notification, and disposal requirements.





Part 040.115 (Proposed Revision)

Acknowledgement of Asbestos Assessment

- Identifies when an AAA is required.
- Defines quantity of disturbance limits.
- Defines documents required for a complete application.




Business Impact Summary
