**SUBJECT:** Recommendation to approve allocation of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds through the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund (SLFRF) in the total amount of [\$280,000] for the following 3 projects:

a. Medical Examiner's Office Renovation \$130,000

b. South Valleys Library Renovations \$75,000

c. Spanish Springs Library Renovations \$75,000

Recommendation to approve increased allocations to two previously approved projects:

- d. Increase funding for the Purchase of 1240 E. Ninth Street by \$60,000 for a total of \$4,860,000 to cover acquisition closing costs.
- e. Increase funding for the Health District Lobby Demolition by \$6,135.38 for a total of \$36,135.38 to cover additional concrete removal and lighting for the clinical services demolition.

Recommendation to subgrant previously approved SLFRF funds in the amount of \$100,000 to Brain Health Leadership Foundation for Neuromodulation Treatment Services for individuals in recovery. Pursuant to NRS 244.1505, this is a nonprofit organization created for religious, charitable or educational purposes, and if approved authorize the County Manager to sign the necessary grant documents.

The total amount of allocations is \$346,135.38. If approved, direct the Comptroller's Office to make necessary net zero cross-fund and/or cross-functional budget appropriation transfers. Manager's Office. (All Commission Districts.) FOR POSSIBLE ACTION

### **SUMMARY**

The report requests approval of three new internal renovation projects for Washoe County (Medical Examiner's Office, South Valleys Library and Spanish Springs Library). The report also includes two amendments to previously approved ARPA-SLFRF projects for the

purchase of 1240 East Ninth Street and to the Northern Nevada Public Health Lobby Demolition project. Lastly, the report includes a subgrant to the Brain Health Leadership Foundation which was identified to carry out service related to the Neuromodulation Treatment award approved by the Board in July 2023.

## **PREVIOUS ACTION**

On August 22, 2023, the Board approved the purchase and sale agreement of 1240 E. Ninth Street for \$4,800,000.

On July 18, 2023, the Board approved allocations for \$6,231,494 to support 20 new projects for community and regional initiatives. These included the Department of Alternative Sentencing Neuromodulation Treatment Project which is related to the Brain Health Leadership Foundation subaward being considered.

On July 11, 2023, the Board considered two library projects and removed them from the list of approved projects due to alternative funding identified. The Board approved funds for the Health District Lobby demolition.

On December 20, 2022, the Board approved the allocation of funds to support the purchase of 1240 E. Ninth Street, formerly West Hills, for \$4,800,000.

#### **BACKGROUND**

On March 11, 2021, the American Rescue Plan Act was signed into law, and established the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund and Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund. Washoe County was awarded a grant of \$91,587,038 in State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF).
