

Master Plan Components





Goal Fourteen: Protect sensitive and important lands in developing areas through appropriate development techniques.

Policies

C.14.1

In developing areas protect prime agricultural lands that should remain open for other considerations. This includes lands:

- a. Not planned to receive urban services.
- b. Subject to safety risks, such as flooding.
- Contributing to groundwater recharge and protection of the watershed.
- d. Appropriate for the containment of urban sprawl and to provide a buffer between urban and suburban/rural areas, or between incompatible land uses.
- e. Serving the public good through the aesthetic, cultural and scenic benefits that open space provides.




- Create a concise, usable, accessible document

Plan Structure




- Reshuffling of Elements to tier from Regional Plan

- Move detailed standards into development code



Area Plans



- Combining all plans (except Tahoe) into Chapter 2 of the Master Plan
- Refinement of character statements, goals, policies, and actions
- Move detailed standards into development code




Plan Structure

Statements which further refine the principles and guide the County's course of action to achieve the principles. They should guide decision-making and give clear indication of intent.


Actions

2021-2022 Timeline






SC: Steering Committee

Public Outreach



- Engagement directly with members of the public
 - CAB meetings (14 to date)
 - Public Workshops (7 to date)
 - Online Surveys (2 surveys with 820+ responses)
 - Online Commenting (1,200 views and 217 comments)
 - Community Advisory Committee meetings (CAC) (5 to date)

- Engagement with stakeholders and agency partners
 - One-on-one meetings (20+)
 - Opportunities to comment (40+ agencies)
 - Steering Committee (SC)
 meetings (7 to date)
 - Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) (5 to date)

Public Outreach Phases



Phase 1—Surveys, CAB meetings, advisory committee meetings to determine new plan format

Phase 2—Feedback on sections of preliminary draft

- Feedback from stakeholders and through advisory committees on new "elements"
- Public workshops and online commenting on area plans

Phase 3—Feedback on full draft
