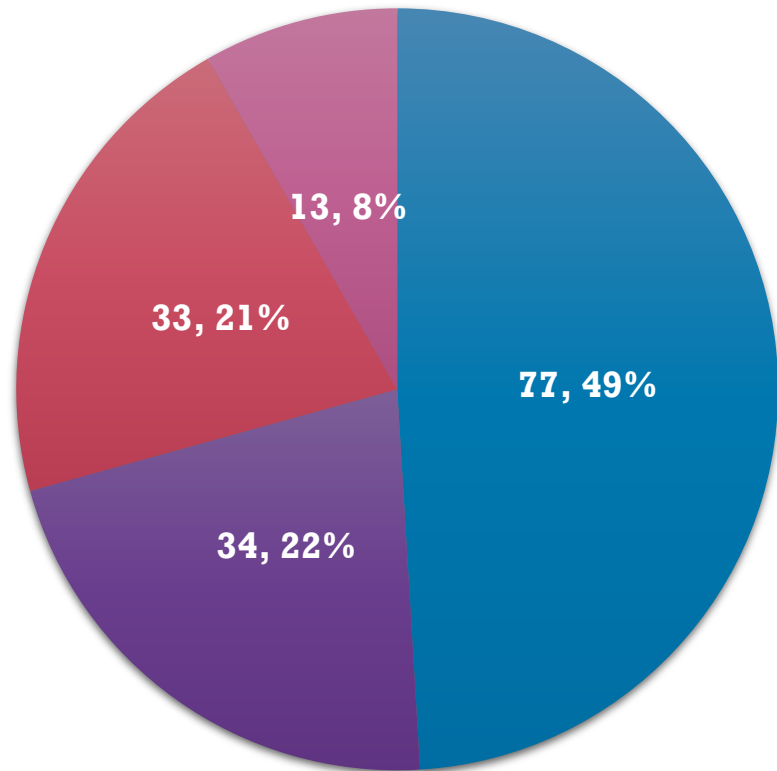

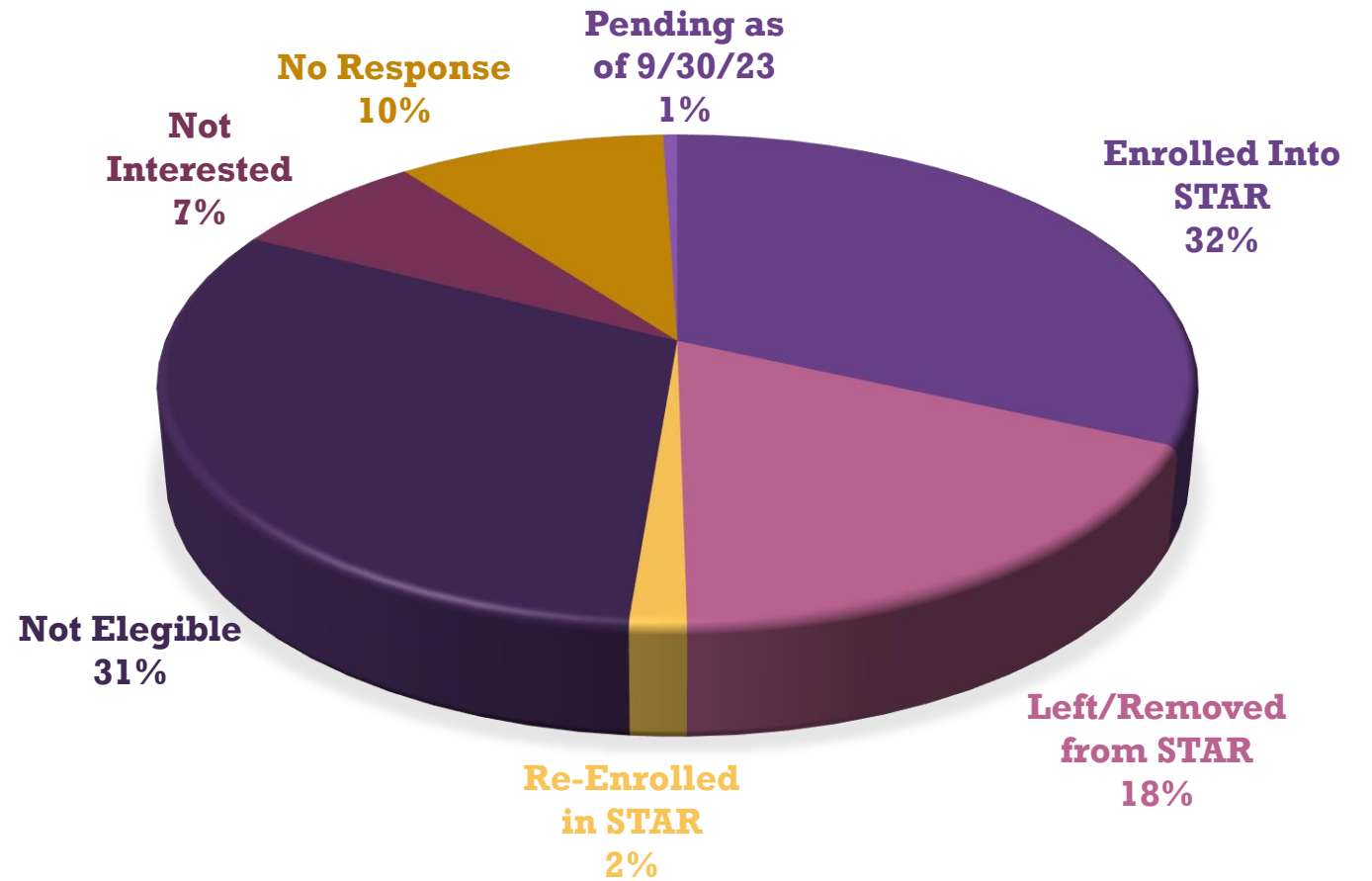
STAR Program Overview

- Multidisciplinary supervision model focused on DAS supervisees struggling with opioid use disorder (OUD).
- Clear focus on root causes of addiction and mental illness to address criminal behavior.
- “All change is self-change.”

12-Month Contact Data Review

- 71 Addiction Medication (MAT) Referrals
- 234 counseling sessions completed
- 2,418 Peer Recovery Support Specialist (PRSS) contacts completed
 - 6 STAR participants currently enrolled in PRSS Certification course
- 309 Home Visits completed



Redefining Success, Reinforcing Public Safety

- 17 Violation Arrests among a total of 62 participants over a 12-month period.
- 4 Participants accrued new criminal charges, with 2 being ordered to return to the STAR program.
- In the year prior to STAR's inception, 65% of the individuals currently enrolled were arrested 2 or more times and charged criminally. Since the launch of STAR, a mere 6% of the individuals engaged in the program have gone on to accrue new criminal charges.

12-Month Overdose Data Review

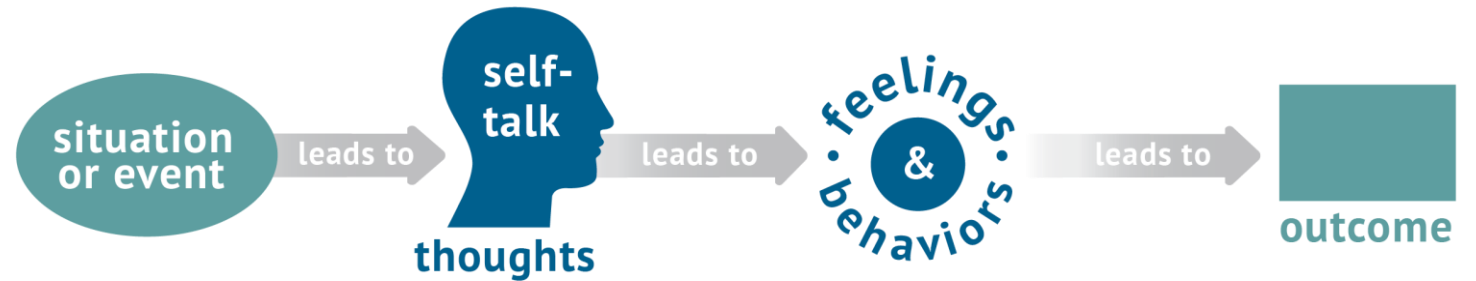


- 11 total overdoses where medical intervention was required.
 - 18% of all participants served over the course of 12-months.
- 7 who overdosed remain active participants in STAR.
- 3 participants were removed from programming for overall program nonadherence.
- 1 overdose death.

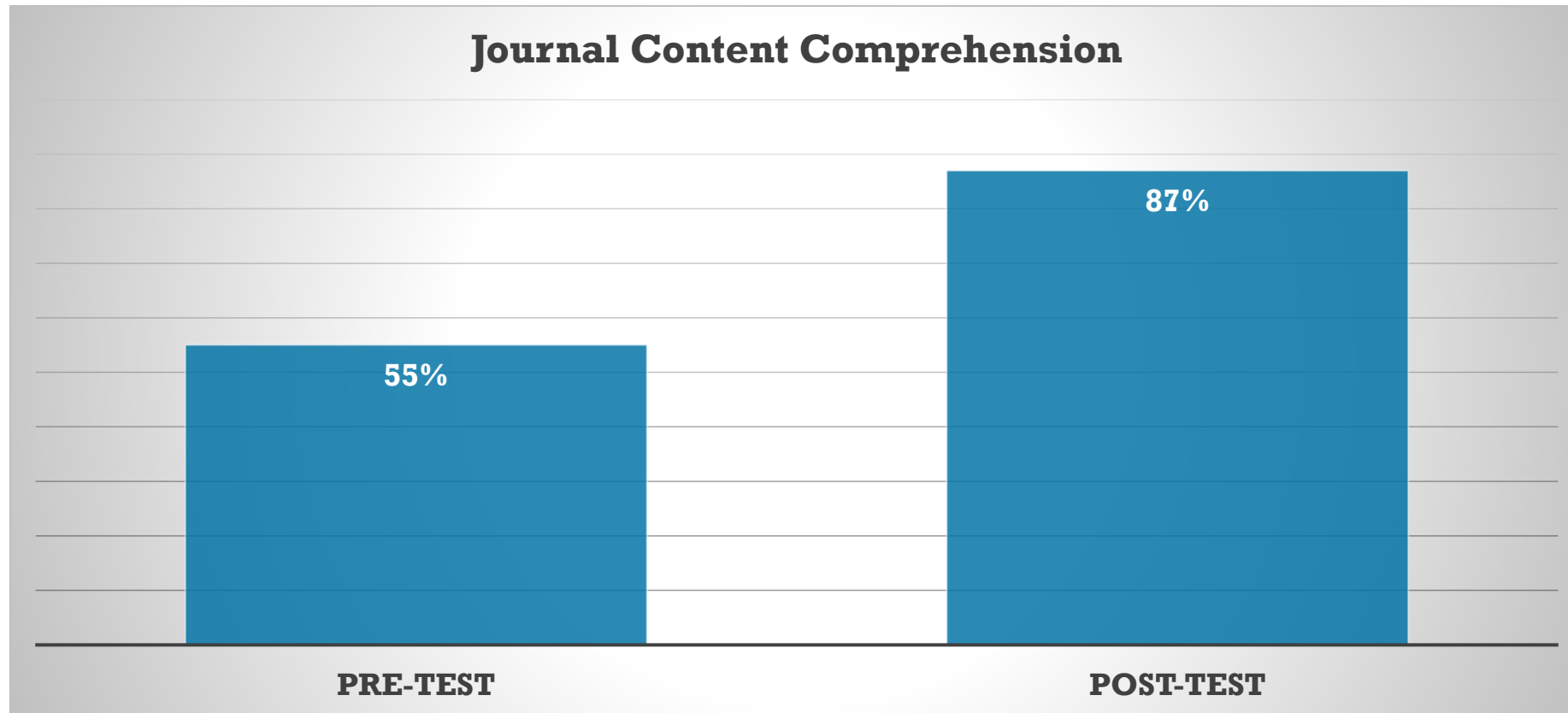


Courage to Change[®] is a

- 103 one-on-one journaling sessions completed.
- 31 group journaling sessions completed.
- 165 journals distributed.



12-Month Journaling Data Review

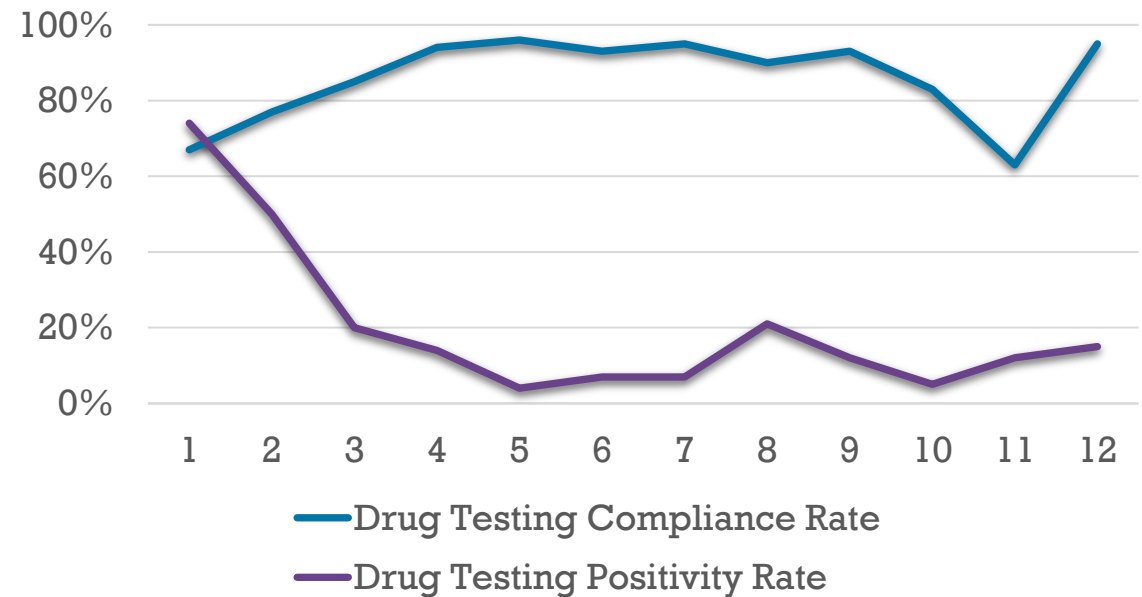


- 32% average increase in journal content comprehension when comparing pre-test/post-test data.

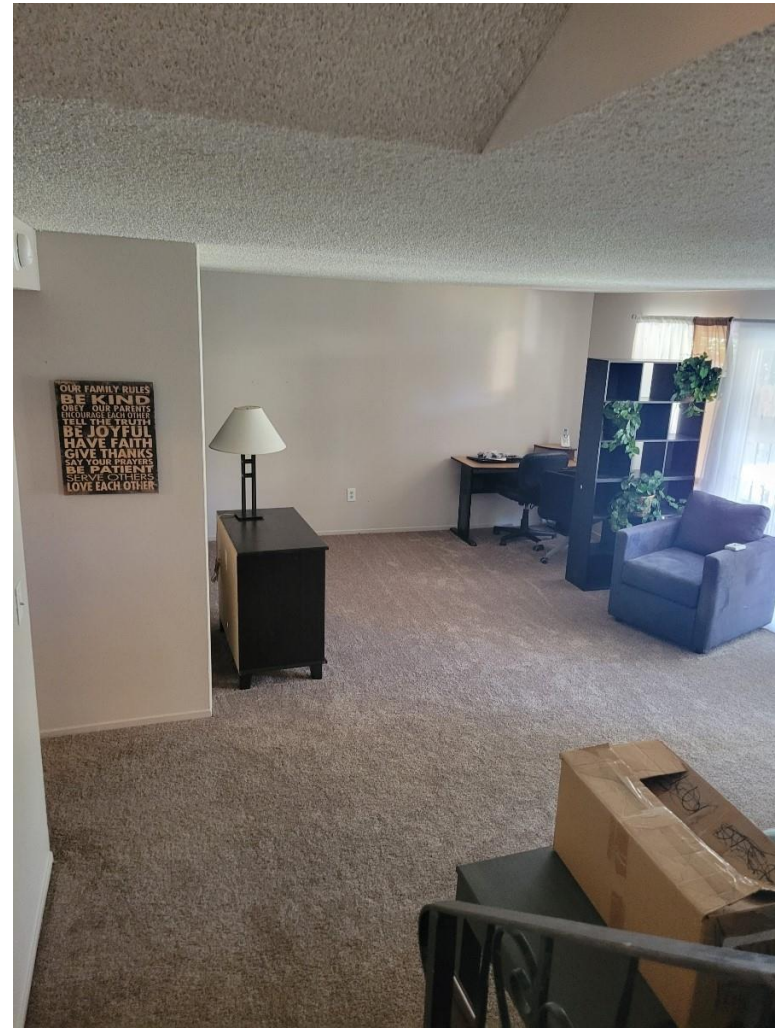
