acknowledge a grant of \$35,000 [\$15,000 County match required], awarded to the Second Judicial District Court from the Supreme Court of Nevada, Administrative Office of the Courts to enhance the administration of drug and alcohol testing services for the grant period April 30, 2025 to December 31, 2026; and direct Finance to make the necessary budget amendments.

SUMMARY

The Second Judicial District Court (SJDC) has been awarded \$35,000 in state grant funding to enhance the administration of drug and alcohol testing services for our specialty court programs. This award will be used to support the drug testing protocols for the Adult Drug, Veterans, Felony DUI, Youth Offender, Mental Health, Medication-Assisted Treatment, and Prison Reentry Courts.

PREVIOUS ACTION

BACKGROUND

For nearly three decades, the SJDC has been a leader in the development and implementation of specialty court programs. The SJDC has seven specialty court programs, serving more than 800 participants each year. Their mission is to improve the quality of life, reduce recidivism, and increase community safety and awareness by engaging the drug and alcohol abusing defendant, or the defendant with a mental health illness, in an intensive, court supervised, treatment program. Drug and alcohol testing is a key component of the specialty court programs; it provides readily available and objective information to the treatment team regarding a participant's progress in the program. The testing process, coupled with immediate program responses, forces defendants to address their substance abuse problems immediately and continuously, which prevents relapse, overdose, and continued substance use.

All courts receiving AOC funds must comply with best practices and specific criteria outlined in Nevada Specialty Court Funding Guidelines and Criteria, as established by the Specialty Court Funding Committee and approved by the Judicial Council of the State of Nevada. As such, every specialty court client is required to participate in weekly random drug and alcohol testing.
