SUBJECT: Recommendation to approve Amendment No. 1 to the Agreement for Professional Consulting Services between Sierra Nevada Construction, Inc. and Washoe County to provide Construction Manager-At-Risk (CMAR) preconstruction services in support of the Pleasant Valley Interceptor Reach 3 Project [in the amount of \$31,750.00 for a total contract amount of \$330,631.00]. This amendment allows for supplemental preconstruction services for the additional development of dewatering design and analysis for more complex than anticipated groundwater conditions and the procurement of polymer precast lift station components to support the Pleasant Valley Interceptor Reach 3 Project. (Commission District 2.) FOR POSSIBLE ACTION

SUMMARY

Staff requests the Board of County Commissioners approve Amendment No. 1 to the Professional Services Agreement with Sierra Nevada Construction, Inc. for the Manager-At-Risk (CMAR) preconstruction services in support of the Pleasant Valley Interceptor Reach 3 Project. The purpose of this amendment is to provide additional development of dewatering design and analysis for more complex than anticipated groundwater conditions and the procurement of polymer precast lift station components.

This amendment is necessary to advance the design and construction of GMP #2 dewatering and GMP#3 for the additional sewer interceptor, borings beneath creeks and associated sensitive areas, as well as the construction of a new sanitary sewer lift station.

PREVIOUS ACTION

On December 16, 2025, the Board of County Commissioners (Board) authorized Sierra Nevada Construction, Inc., as the Construction Manager-At-Risk (CMAR) and approve Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP 1) Agreement to construct reclaimed water pipelines, gravity sewer pipelines, sewer force main pipelines, and appurtenances, to support the Pleasant Valley Interceptor Reach 3 Project in the amount of \$6,538,873.95.

On August 8, 2025, Washoe County entered into a professional service agreement for preconstruction services with Sierra Nevada Construction, Inc. approved by Washoe County Purchasing Manager.

On May 20, 2025, the Board of County Commissioners (Board) adopted the Washoe County Final budget for Fiscal Year 2026 as well as adopting the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) for Fiscal Years 2026-2030.

On June 20, 2023, the Board approved Amendment No. 1 to an Agreement for Professional Consulting Services between Washoe County and Carollo to provide professional engineering permitting services, engineering construction management and environmental engineering oversight for Pleasant Valley Sanitary Sewer Interceptor - Reach 3 Project and the Pleasant Valley Sanitary Sewer Lift Station Project within the STMWRF service area in the amount of \$811,367.70.

On April 12, 2022, the Board approved a Grant of Sanitary Sewer and Reclaim Facilities Easement for the Pleasant Valley Sanitary Sewer Interceptor Reach 3 Project and approved the payment of \$15,000.00 for the easement to 40 Zircon LLC, according to the appraised valuation dated January 12, 2022.

On May 11, 2021, the Board approved an Agreement for Professional Consulting Services between Washoe County and Kautz Environmental Consultants, Inc. to provide pre-construction cultural resource mitigation activities for Reach 3 of the Pleasant Valley Sewer Interceptor Project within the South Truckee Meadows Water Reclamation Facility (STMWRF) service area in the amount of \$391,681.00.

On May 11, 2021, the Board authorized, as an invited signatory, the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) among the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection, the US Environmental Protection Agency (Region 9), the Nevada State Historic Preservation Officer and Washoe County, (UT #2019-5827), for the Pleasant Valley Interceptor Reach 3 Project located within the STMWRF service territory, a project necessary to respond to sanitary sewer demands from new area development.

On June 23, 2020, the Board approved an Agreement for Professional Engineering Services between Washoe County and Carollo to provide construction management and bidding services for Pleasant Valley Interceptor Reach 3 and Pleasant Valley Lift Station Construction Management Services in the amount of \$1,873,241.00.

On August 28, 2018, the Board approved an agreement for consulting engineering services with Carollo, to provide final engineering design and bidding services for the Pleasant Valley Reach 3 Sanitary Sewer Interceptor project commencing August 28, 2018 through January 31, 2020 in the amount of \$838,797.00.

BACKGROUND

Washoe County owns and operates STMWRF, which provides sewer treatment to approximately 25,000 homes and businesses within southern Washoe County, including portions of the City of Reno.

The Pleasant Valley Interceptor Sanitary Sewer – Reach 3 project was identified several years ago as a project necessary to expand the service territory south in response to new development. The Project will expand sewer collection service for the South Truckee Meadows from the Damonte Ranch Parkway to the vicinity of Towne Drive.

Construction elements that are part of the project include reclaimed water pipelines, gravity sewer pipelines, sewer force main pipelines, appurtenances, jack-and-bore operations beneath U.S. Highway 395 and Geiger Grade, roadway restoration and the early procurement of select equipment that includes submersible pumps, backup diesel pump, auxiliary diesel power generator, lift station electrical, lighting, disconnects, transfer switch, and instrumentation.

Staff have planned for this project to be delivered via three construction work packages. GMP #2 includes dewatering and the procurement of polymer precast lift station components, and it is anticipated that GMP #3 will include additional sewer interceptor, borings beneath creeks and associated sensitive areas, as well as the construction of a new sanitary sewer lift station. This new lift station will allow the County to demolish the existing lift station that has exceeded its useful life and has become more costly to maintain and operate.

FISCAL IMPACT

Should the Board approve Amendment No. 1 to the Professional Services Agreement with Sierra Nevada Construction, Inc. for \$31,750.00 [for total contract amount of \$330,631.00]; there is sufficient funds and budget authority in FY26 in the Utilities Fund (566), Pleasant Valley Interceptor Project (WR842017), Construction Contracts (781080). Revenues in support of the project are provided from sewer connection fees.

RECOMMENDATION
