


Collection Development Policy and Procedures









Collection Development Mission: Curate a collection of library materials to reflect the needs and interests of our community

- 478,000 volumes across 12 branches + "digital branch"
- 1,978,000 checkouts during Fiscal Year 2023
- Fiscal Year 2023 Materials Spending: \$1,014,720
- Added 39,212 physical items and 17,571 eBook/eAudio copies



Forecasting New Titles - 86% of purchases

- Past performance of author nationally and locally
- Editorial book reviews
- Tracking of national presale orders
- Order as early as a year in advance and monitor the number of holds to determine number of copies needed
- Goal is to have title on the shelf on street date

Submit Request

- Purchase requests fill any gaps in collection
- More than 600 requests/month
- Interlibrary loan available for titles we don't purchase



Collection Development Policy Highlights

Scope of Collection: Current and popular

Criteria for materials:

- Suitability of subject and style for intended audience
- Attention by critics and expert reviewers
- Reputation and significance of author
- Cost
- Consideration of work as a whole
- Representation of diverse points of view and opinions



Reconsideration of Library Materials

- Formal process for community members to challenge an item in the collection
- Library Director responds in writing
- User may appeal decision to Library Board of Trustees

Current censorship threats

- Hate speech found in books
- Censorship by hiding materials
