## **RESOLUTION** – Authorizing the Grant of Public Monies to a Government Entity

WHEREAS, NRS 244.1505 provides that a Board of County Commissioners may expend money for any purpose which will provide a substantial benefit to the inhabitants of the County and that a board may make a grant of money to a nonprofit organization created for religious, charitable or educational purposes or to a governmental entity to be expended for a selected purpose; and

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners of Washoe County upon the recommendation of Commissioner Mariluz Garcia for District 3, has determined that \$5,000.00 will be granted to Glenn Duncan STEM Academy towards commissioning a physical education teacher, purchasing of athletic equipment, commissioning an artist for a new mural and retouching an existing mural, supporting the students and families with counseling, and purchasing social-emotional classroom materials; and

WHEREAS, Glenn Duncan STEM Academy, as part of the Washoe County School District, is dedicated to academic growth, developing, recruiting, and training highly effective personnel, family, and community engagement, continuous improvement, and providing a safe and welcoming school for the benefit of its students; and

**WHEREAS,** Glenn Duncan STEM Academy supports our community by helping every dolphin (student), every day, whatever it takes; now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**, By the Board of Commissioners of Washoe County that:

- 1. The Board hereby grants to the Glenn Duncan STEM Academy a grant for fiscal year 2023-2024 in the amount of \$5,000.00.
- 2. The Board finds that in making this grant a substantial benefit will be provided to the residents in Washoe County by supporting a thriving community, supporting long-term sustainability, and strengthen our culture of service.
- 3. The funds shall not be used to purchase tickets to special events.
