SUMMARY

The Washoe County Sheriff's Office has partnered with the Nevada Department of Public Safety through the Residential Substance Abuse Treatment Grant (RSAT). The funds from this grant are being utilized to augment the current Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) Program by increasing supportive resources for re-entry into the community and sustaining needs for an evidence-based journalling curriculum to our inmate population, specifically targeting the inmates participating in the MAT Program and Young Offenders Program. The funds will also be utilized to purchase hygiene kits and 31-day bus passes to be issued to participants of the programs and those identified who may need basic needs and transportation to various treatment appointments upon release.

The journals will continue to be purchased through The Change Company located in Carson City, Nevada. The literature provides evidence-based curriculum in the form of guided journals for individuals impacted by harmful substance use and teaches them addiction education, coping strategies, anger management, substance use behaviors, and life skills which prepares them for re-entry into our community and help the effort to reduce recidivism. Local partners and programmers also use The Change Company journals and this will provide consistency for their care throughout our community.

<u>Washoe County Strategic Objective supported by this item:</u> Vulnerable Populations: Support vulnerable populations with a regional approach.

PREVIOUS ACTION

On August 20, 2024, the Board authorized item #10.K.2., the award of the 2021 RSAT Grant from the Nevada Department of Public Safety award of \$63,102.00 for the 2021 RSAT Grant award year.

On February 20, 2024, the Board authorized item #9.I.3., the award of the 2020 RSAT Grant from the Nevada Department of Public Safety award of \$37,396.00 for the 2020 RSAT Grant award year.

On October 10, 2023, the Board authorized item #7.F.2., the award of the 2019 RSAT Grant as a new funding source for the Washoe County Sheriff's Office.

BACKGROUND

Washoe County Sheriff's Office began a partnership with the Nevada Department of Public Safety, Office of Criminal Justice, to address substance use problems and challenges of re-entry into the community. The additional funding supports our current program and will continue purchasing and utilizing evidence-based curriculum that offers an opportunity for the criminal justice population to learn about managing addiction, increase personal coping skills and gain resources to meet basic needs such as housing, food, employment, and transportation for their transition back into the community which can lower the risk of recidivism. The goal of increasing participation in our programs while incarcerated will help the end goal of successfully engaging in prosocial activities while working towards long term recovery in the community.

Reason for retroactive submittal: Item was submitted to the first available BCC meeting once paperwork was received and processed.
