# Welfare of the Inmates

- ▶ Welfare of inmates in custody include these factors:
  - ▶ Health of inmates
  - ▶ Access to medical care
  - ▶ Infectious disease and vermin control
  - ▶ Food services
  - ▶ Environmental controls
  - ▶ Safety of inmates
  - ▶ Out of cell time

# Welfare of Inmates

## COVID-19 Update

- ▶ Steps taken to mitigate COVID-19 threat to jail population
  - ▶ Cancelled all in person contact with inmates
    - ▶ Increased iWeb, telephone, email access
  - ▶ Cancelled all inmate transports outside facility
  - ▶ Cancelled all inmate programming
  - ▶ COVID education campaign
  - ▶ Waived medical assessment fee
  - ▶ Creation of Isolation/Quarantine Unit
  - ▶ Created COVID-19 pre-screening station in Intake
  - ▶ Reduced tier time numbers for social distancing
  - ▶ Started testing ALL new inmates prior to being transferred to General Housing
  - ▶ Issued masks to all inmates traveling outside their assigned housing unit

# Welfare of the Inmates

## COVID - 19 Update

- ▶ Intake Isolation Unit (HU 1 & 7)
- ▶ COVID-19 Quarantine Unit (HU11)
  
- ▶ 878 Inmates Tested\*
  - ▶ State of Nevada laboratory
  - ▶ Additional 500+ rapid scan tests
  
- ▶ 127 Total Inmates Positive for COVID-19
  - ▶ 15 positive upon booking
  
- ▶ 2 Inmates (1 male, 1 female) sent to the hospital for worsening COVID-19 symptoms

• \* - Numbers are approximate and may not account for those tested prior to the start of data collection

# Washoe County Detention Facility COVID -19 Update

- ▶ Jail Inoculation Plan
  - ▶ Tier 4 (March/April)
  - ▶ High Risk Population
    - ▶ End of February
    - ▶ Congruent to tier availability

# Welfare of the Inmates

- ▶ Jail continues to see increase in mental health population
  - ▶ Housing Unit 3 and Medical Unit at capacity
  - ▶ Special watch cells regularly at capacity
  - ▶ Three housing units for mental health population
    - ▶ Housing Unit 3, 6, & 16
  - ▶ 206 averted suicides
  - ▶ 11 attempted suicides








# FY 20/21 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Average Daily Population

## ▶ Battery by Inmate


- ▶ Inmate vs Inmate - 9

    - ▶ Baking and Pastry Certificate
  - ▶ Team consists of 9 chefs with more than 150 years of combined experience in the food industry
- ▶ Highlights in the past 2 years
  - ▶ Menus for breakfast, lunch and dinner
  - ▶ Menus expansion
    - ▶ Increased spice purchases, adding cinnamon to oatmeal, cheddar cheese sauce to grits
  - ▶ 9% cost savings on produce
  - ▶ Increased dessert menu
    - ▶ From Pudding and Jell-o to chocolate heart, red velvet, almond flavored, yellow iced cakes, apple sauce, mandarin orange cups, Chuck E. Cheese Birthday Cakes for Dr. Martin Luther King Jr's Birthday

## ▶ Highlights in past 2 years (Continued)

### ▶ Increased Bread Varieties

- ▶ Pumpnickel, onion rolls, croissants, sweet yeast rolls, French baguettes, hoagies, Kaiser rolls, buttermilk biscuits
- ▶ Cinnamon rolls on Sunday morning
- ▶ Biscuits and gravy on Thursday mornings

### ▶ Repurposed products for menu variety

- ▶ Older bananas utilized for bread and pudding
- ▶ Over 100,000 apples and oranges and nearly a half million bananas each year
- ▶ Using purchased ingredients to expand salad dressing options
  - ▶ 1,000 Island, ranch, soy vinaigrette, Italian vinaigrette

### ▶ Special, Religious and Medical Diets

- ▶ Partnership with NaphCare medical director, Dr. Eloy Ituarte
  - ▶ Diabetic, low salt, kidney and dialysis meals
  - ▶ Baked nutrition bars for medication assistance
  - ▶ Vegetarian, Kosher and special religious meals
