SUBJECT: Recommendation to accept a renewed National Children's Alliance (NCA) Chapter Grant to the District Attorney's Office in the amount of [\$136,488, no match required], from the U.S. Department of Justice through the National Children's Alliance to fund chapter activities including professional services, supplies, registrations, dues, and travel retroactive from January 1, 2026 through December 31, 2026; direct Finance to make the necessary budget amendments and retroactively authorize the District Attorney or his designees to sign the cooperative agreement. (All Commission Districts.)

SUMMARY

The Washoe Board of County Commissioners must accept grant awards, and must approve amendments to the adopted fiscal year budget and direct Finance to make the necessary budget amendments.

State chapters of the National Children's Alliance receive annual funding for their activities in support of Child Advocacy Centers within their state. The District Attorney's Office – home to the Washoe County Child Advocacy Center – is acting as the fiscal arm of the Nevada chapter (Children's Advocacy Centers of Nevada).

Washoe County Strategic Objective supported by this item: Safe, Secure and Healthy Communities

Award is retroactive to January 1, 2025 as the final documents were delayed.

PREVIOUS ACTION

On June 17, 2025, the BCC accepted a renewed National Children's Alliance (NCA) Chapter Grant to the District Attorney's Office in the amount of [\$136,249.00, no match required], from the U.S. Department of Justice through the National Children's Alliance to fund chapter activities including professional services, supplies, registrations, dues, and travel retroactive from January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025;

On June 28, 2024, the BCC accepted additional funds for existing National Children's Alliance Grant (NCA) Chapter Grant to the to the District Attorney's Office acting as the fiscal agent of the Children's Advocacy Centers of Nevada in the amount of [\$136,507.00, no match] from the U.S. Department of Justice through the NCA to fund chapter activities including professional services, supplies, registrations, dues, and travel; extend the award period through to December 31, 2024.

On January 16, 2024, the Board accepted a National Children's Alliance Grant (NCA) Chapter Grant to the to the District Attorney's Office acting as the fiscal agent of the Children's Advocacy Centers of Nevada in the amount of [\$112,446, no match] from the U.S. Department of Justice through the National Children's Alliance to fund chapter activities; retroactive from January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023.

The Board has accepted the NCA chapter grant for the benefit of the Children's Advocacy Centers of Nevada (CACNV) and the District Attorney's Office since 2020.

BACKGROUND

The Child Advocacy Centers of Nevada (CACNV) serves as the accredited state chapter of Child Advocacy Centers for Nevada. The mission of CACNV is to bolster and enhance Child Advocacy Centers, ensuring that sexually abused and exploited children in Nevada possess a voice, a safe space for healing, and dependable support. The Nevada CACs offer a variety of services to children and non-offending family members, delivered by multi-disciplinary teams across their respective jurisdictions throughout the state. Currently, there are four child advocacy centers located across the state in Washoe, Clark, Elko, and Nye Counties. The Washoe County District Attorney's Office serves as the fiscal agent for the state chapter.

The Washoe County Child Advocacy Center benefits from the CACNV goals:

1. Establish and maintain CAC accreditation throughout the state.
2. Support and enhance existing CAC programs.
3. Assist CAC establish and improve their Multi-Disciplinary Teams.
4. Provide outreach, education, and support throughout Nevada.
5. Maintain and grow funding for CACs in Nevada.

Award is retroactive to January 1, 2026 as the final documents were delayed.
