### **SUMMARY**

Through Washoe County's participation in the Built for Zero initiative, a funding proposal was submitted and approved to provide funding for application fees, security deposits, background checks and legal fees to seal eviction records. This funding will be utilized to address credit, rental and/or criminal background related housing barriers for people experiencing homelessness in order to obtain permanent housing.

The Washoe Board of County Commissioners must accept grant awards, and must approve amendments to the adopted fiscal year budget and direct the Comptroller's Office to make the necessary budget amendments.

#### PREVIOUS ACTION

At a concurrent meeting held August 30, 2021, Amendment No. 2, and Extension of Interlocal Cooperative Agreement for Shelter Operation and Other Homeless Services Among the City of Reno, Washoe County and the City of Sparks was approved revising the roles and responsibilities of the entities, including transferring the administrative and financial responsibility for the operation of homeless shelters from City of Reno to Washoe County.

On January 13, 2021, direction was provided by the BCC to include pursuing an expanded role in addressing the regional issue of homelessness in the Strategic Plan.

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On November 18, 2020, the parties entered into an Interlocal Cooperative Agreement for Shelter Operation and Other Homeless Services Among The City of Reno, Washoe County and The City of Sparks which established duties, roles and responsibilities of the parties in regard to the provision of services to the homeless in the Cities and County, including agreeing to acquire and cost share three parcels on East 4th Street for the purpose of expanding shelter capacity in the region to assist people experiencing homelessness.

#### BACKGROUND

Washoe County has participated in and served as the lead entity for the Built for Zero initiative since January of 2020. The Built for Zero initiative aims to end homelessness for all through coordination of the service delivery system and data centralization.

Through Washoe County's participation in the Built for Zero initiative, a funding proposal was submitted and approved to provide funding for application fees, security deposits, background checks and legal fees to seal eviction records. This funding will be utilized to address credit, rental and/or criminal background related housing barriers for people experiencing homelessness in order to obtain permanent housing.
