Northern Nevada Public Health Air Quality Management Division (AQMD) has determined that STC Ventures, LLC is in violation of the District Board of Health Regulations Governing Air Quality Management PART 040.030 DUST CONTROL.

1. VIOLATION

- A. Failure to obtain a Dust Control Permit prior to commencement of a dust generating activity (1) acre or greater.

2. BASIS OF VIOLATION

A. Regulatory Authority

The District Board of Health Regulations Governing Air Quality Management paragraph 040.030.C.3. - DUST CONTROL PERMIT REQUIREMENTS:

The owner and/or operator of a dust generating activity shall apply for and obtain a Dust Control Permit prior to commencement of the dust generating activity. In the Dust Control Permit application, the owner and/or operator shall designate a person responsible for compliance with the "District Board of Health Regulations Governing Air Quality Management." Failure to comply with the provisions of an approved Dust Control Permit shall be deemed a violation of this Rule.

B. Facts to Constitute the Violation

On April 5, 2024 representatives of the AQMD conducted an air quality evaluation of the Yellow Brick Road project covered by Dust Control Permit No. APCP23-0068. During the evaluation the AQMD determined that dust generating activities were occurring outside the acreage covered by the Dust Control Permit. The AQMD advised that all activities in the in the unpermitted acreage must cease. The AQMD advised that an updated application must be submitted to the AQMD to add the additional acreage to Dust Control Permit No. APCP23-0068.

On April 10, 2024 a Dust Control Permit Modification form was submitted to the AQMD to increase the acreage for the Yellow Brick Road project.

On April 16, 2024 the AQMD updated Dust Control Permit No. APCP23-0068 to include the additional acreage on the Yellow Brick Road project.

3. APPEAL PROCEDURE AND TIME LIMITATIONS

A. Appeal Procedure

STC Ventures, LLC is advised that within (10) working days of the receipt of this Notice of Violation, STC Ventures, LLC may submit a written petition for appeal to the Northern Nevada Public Health - Air Quality Hearing Board. The written petition for appeal shall be submitted to the AQMD at the following address:

“CONDITIONS OF OPERATION”

- 1) **VISIBLE EMISSION PROHIBITION:** The owner and/or operator of a source engaging in dust generating activities shall not allow visible fugitive dust emissions for a period or periods accumulating more than 5 minutes in any hour. Washoe County District Board of Health Regulations Governing Air Quality Management 040.030(C)(1).
- 2) The owner and/or operator of any unpaved parking lot or staging area shall not allow visible fugitive dust emissions for a period or periods accumulating more than 5 minutes in any hour and shall meet at least one of the standards in 040.030(C)(2)(a).
- 3) The owner and/or operator of any unpaved haul/access road (whether at a work site that is under construction or at a work site that is temporarily or permanently inactive) shall not allow visible fugitive dust emissions for a period or periods accumulating more than 5 minutes in any hour and shall meet at least one of the standards in 040.030(C)(2)(b).
- 4) The owner and/or operator of an open area and vacant lot or any disturbed surface area on which no activity is occurring shall meet at least one of the standards in 040.030(C)(2)(c).
- 5) All open storage piles shall be stabilized by utilizing at least one of the standards described in 040.030(C)(2)(d).
- 6) The owner and/or operator shall erect an informational sign at the main entrance to the project site prior to breaking ground. The sign shall remain in place for the duration of the project. The sign shall meet all the criteria listed in the attached Dust Control Permit Sign Template. 040.030(C)(3)(c)
- 7) The owner and/or operator shall submit an updated Dust Control Permit Application upon change of ownership and/or responsibility for the Dust Control Permit. 040.030(C)(3)(b)(2)
- 8) When hauling bulk materials off-site onto paved public roadways, the owner and/or operator shall prevent spillage or loss of bulk material from holes or other openings in the cargo compartment floor, sides, and/or tailgate using at least one of the following control measures: cover all haul trucks with a tarp or other suitable closure, ensure bulk materials contain enough moisture and/or dust suppressant to prevent fugitive dust emissions during transport, and/or load all haul trucks such that the freeboard is not less than six (6) inches. 040.030(C)(4)(a)
- 9) The owner and/or operator shall install and maintain a suitable trackout control device that controls and prevents trackout and removes particulate matter from tires and the exterior surfaces of haul trucks and/or motor vehicles that traverse such work site at all exits onto a paved public roadway. Clean-up of spillage, carry-out, erosion, and/or trackout shall be performed at least daily or immediately at any time during the day if trackout is creating visible fugitive dust emissions for a period or periods accumulating more than 5 minutes in any hour. 040.030(C)(4)(b)

AIR QUALITY MANAGEMENT DIVISION

10) Cessation of operations is required if dust cannot be controlled due to equipment operations and/or gusty wind conditions. During these conditions, continued dust control measures must be implemented as defined in 040.030(B)(5).

11) The Dust Control Permit shall be kept on the specific job site and made available to the Control Officer immediately upon request. 040.030(E)(2)

12) Any person who conducts dust generating activities shall maintain daily records demonstrating compliance with 040.030(C). Daily records shall be made available to the Control Officer immediately upon request. 040.030(E)(2)

13) Failure to comply with the provisions of an approved Dust Control Permit shall be deemed a violation of District Regulations and this Dust Control Permit. Citations may be issued for each day of violation, in amounts up to \$10,000 per day as stated in 020.040 Civil Fines and Penalties.





Clean-up of spillage, carry-out, erosion, and/or trackout shall be performed at least daily or immediately at any time during the day if trackout is creating visible fugitive dust emissions for a period or periods accumulating more than 5 minutes in any hour. 040.030(C)(4)(b)

10) Cessation of operations is required if dust cannot be controlled due to equipment operations and/or gusty wind conditions. During these conditions, continued dust control measures must be implemented as defined in 040.030(B)(5).

12) Any person who conducts dust generating activities shall maintain daily records demonstrating compliance with 040.030(C). Daily records shall be made available to the Control Officer immediately upon request. 040.030(E)(2)

13) Failure to comply with the provisions of an approved Dust Control Permit shall be deemed a violation of District Regulations and this Dust Control Permit. Citations may be issued for each day of violation, in amounts up to \$10,000 per day as stated in 020.040 Civil Fines and Penalties.





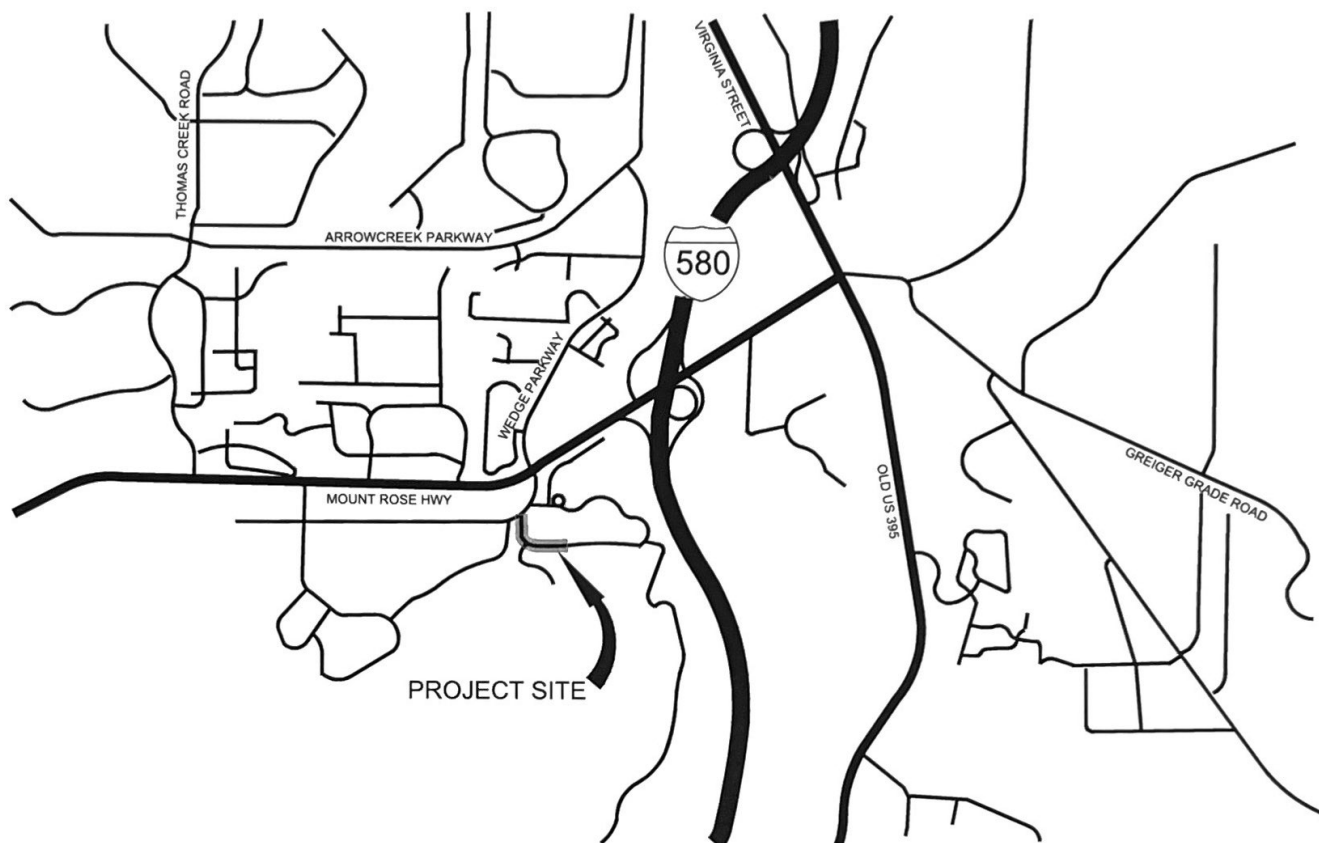

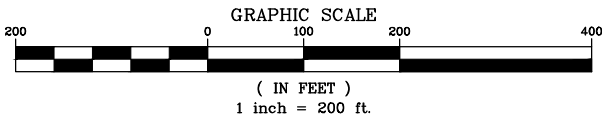
VICINITY MAP

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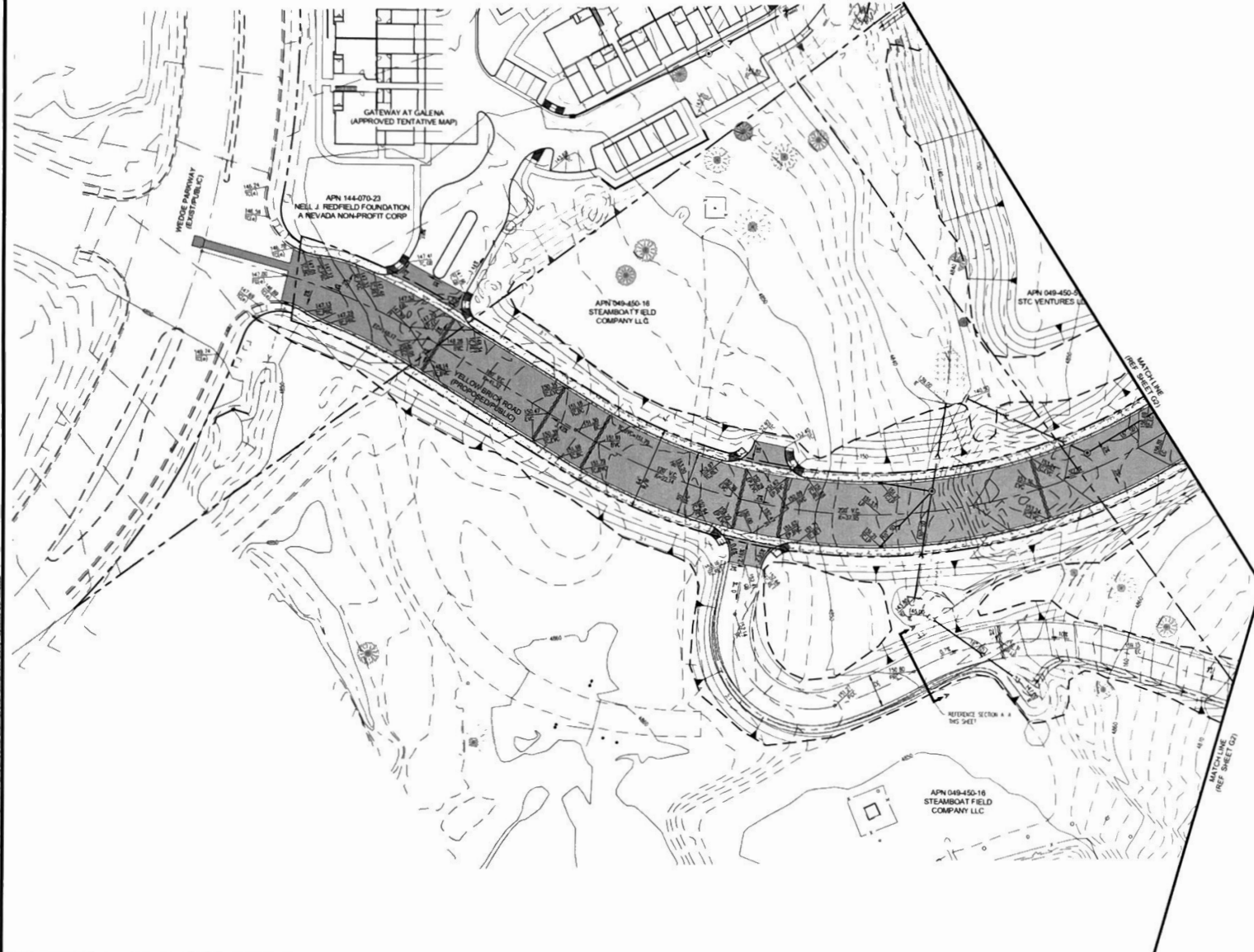
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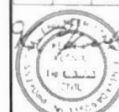

020.040 Civil Fines and Penalties and Administrative
Fine Assessment**

CHAPTER 020 - GENERAL PROVISIONS

PART 020.100 - VIOLATIONS OF REGULATIONS AND PENALTIES

SECTION A - VIOLATION OF REGULATIONS AND PENALTIES

1. VIOLATION OF REGULATIONS

- a. In determining whether a violation of these regulations has been committed, whether the violation was intentional or inadvertent is immaterial and does not constitute cause for dismissal of the case by the Hearing Board or District Board of Health. However, either board may consider whether the violation was intentional or inadvertent in determining the amount of the penalty to be imposed.

2. NOTICE OF VIOLATION

- a. Whenever the Control Officer or their authorized agent or representative has a reasonable cause to believe that any section of these regulations for the prevention, abatement or control of air pollution has been violated, the Control Officer shall cause written notice to be served upon the person or persons responsible for the alleged violations.
- b. The notice shall specify:
 - (1) The section or sections of these regulations alleged to be violated.
 - (2) The facts alleged to constitute the violation.
 - (3) Appeal procedure including any time limitations.
- c. The notice may include an order to take corrective action within a reasonable time, which shall be specified. Such an order becomes final unless, within ten (10) working days after service of the notice, a person named in the order requests a hearing before the Hearing Board.
- d. With or without the issuance of an order pursuant to paragraph 020.100.A.2.c:
 - (1) The Control Officer or their authorized agent or representative may notify the person or persons responsible for the alleged violation to appear before the Hearing Board at a specified time and place; or
 - (2) The Hearing Board may initiate proceedings for recovery of the appropriate penalty set forth in paragraph 020.100.A.3.
- e. Nothing in this section prevents the Hearing Board or the Control Officer or their authorized agent or representative from making efforts to obtain voluntary compliance through warning, conference, or other appropriate means.

3. CIVIL FINES AND PENALTIES

- a. Except as provided in paragraphs 020.100.A.3.b. and c., a violation of any section of these regulations constitutes a major violation. Failure to comply with any condition of an operating permit constitutes a violation.
- b. Any person who commits a major violation of any section of these regulations, other than paragraph 020.100.A.5. and SECTION 020.000.D., is guilty of a civil offense and may be required to pay an administrative fine of not more than \$10,000.00 per day, per violation. Each day of violation constitutes a separate offense. The District Board of Health may establish a compliance schedule as a part of any civil

finding either in lieu of, or in addition to, monetary penalties. Any fines assessed may be held in abeyance pending fulfillment of any compliance schedule.

- c. Violations of PARTS 040.030 (Dust Control), 040.035 (Open Burning), 040.040 (Fire Set for Training), 040.050 (Incinerator Emission), 040.051 (Wood-Burning Devices), 040.055 (Odorous Emissions), 040.080 (Gasoline Transfer and Dispensing Facilities), 040.200 (Diesel Engine Idling) or 050.001 (Emergency Episode Plan) of these regulations constitutes a minor violation unless there are three or more violations of any one of those PARTS by a person or entity, occurring within a period of twelve (12) consecutive months. All minor violations become major violations upon the occurrence of the third violation of the same PART within a period of twelve (12) consecutive months.

- (1) The first offense of a minor violation shall result in an administrative fine of \$500.
- (2) The second offense of a minor violation shall result in an administrative fine of \$1,000.
- (3) Administrative non-compliance of the PARTS described in this paragraph (i.e. incomplete Dust Log, on site permit missing) shall constitute a warning. Any further administrative non-compliance with conditions of the PARTS described in this paragraph may constitute a violation.

- d. Administrative fines shall be levied by appropriate action of the District Board of Health and recorded in its official minutes. The evidence or information on which the District Board of Health bases its action may include any one or more of the following:

- (1) The recommendation of the Control Officer, or their authorized agent or representative, based on any Notice of Violation served on any person in accordance with these regulations if that person has not appeared or requested a hearing before the Hearing Board.
- (2) The recommendation of the Hearing Board, based on its findings in connection with any appeal or other matter referred to the District Board of Health in accordance with these regulations.
- (3) Evidence presented before the District Board of Health by any person, public official, or representative of the District Board of Health, provided the person charged with violating any of these regulations has received reasonable notice (at least twenty (20) calendar days in advance) of the hearing at which such evidence is to be presented and is provided an opportunity to present evidence in his defense at the hearing.

- e. Unless the District Board of Health bases its decision on the recommendations and/or findings of the Control Officer, their authorized agent or representative, or the Hearing Board as set forth in paragraphs 020.000.A.3.d.(1) and (2), the District Board of Health shall base its decision as to whether a violation of these regulations has occurred on the evidence presented before the District Board of Health pursuant to paragraph 020.100.A.3.d.(3). Irrelevant, immaterial, or unduly repetitious evidence shall be excluded. Documentary evidence may be received in the form of authenticated copies or excerpts if the original is not readily available and, on request, parties shall be given an opportunity to compare the copy with the original. Each party may call and examine witnesses, introduce exhibits, cross-examine opposing witnesses on any matter relevant to the issues even though such matter was not covered in the direct examination, impeach any witness regardless of which party first was called to testify and rebut the evidence against them. The District Board of Health may take notice of judicially cognizable facts and/or recognized technical or scientific facts within the District Board of Health's specialized knowledge. All decisions of the District Board of Health respecting administrative fines shall be in writing or notice of the District Board of Health's decision shall be forwarded to the aggrieved party at their last known mailing address.

- f. In those cases where it is determined by the District Board of Health that a violation of the Regulations has occurred, the District Board of Health, at its discretion, may choose to waive the fine for a first violation, levy any fine providing it does not exceed the appropriate range limitation, require use of other mitigation methods or schedules of compliance and, in emergency situations, require a stop work order to be issued and/or any other combination of remedies to bring about compliance with the regulations.

- g. All administrative fines collected by the District Board of Health pursuant to this section shall be deposited

in the school district fund of Washoe County.

- h. All monetary fines assessed pursuant to violations of PARTS 030.105 or 030.107 for improper asbestos containing material removal, shall be for an amount greater than the estimated savings obtained by the illegal removal.

4. INJUNCTIVE RELIEF

- a. In addition to any remedy at law hereunder, the Control Officer may apply to a court of competent jurisdiction for any other equitable and injunctive relief to enforce compliance with, or to restrain violation of any provisions of these regulations or to any regulation or rule made and adopted pursuant thereto.

5. INTERFERENCE WITH PERFORMANCE OF DUTY

- a. No person shall refuse entry or access to any authorized representative of the District Board of Health, upon presentation of appropriate credential, who requests entry to inspect any property, premises or place on or at which an air contaminant source is located or is being constructed, installed or established at any reasonable time for the purpose of ascertaining the state of compliance with these regulations. No person shall obstruct, hamper or interfere with any such inspection. If entry is refused, or prior to attempting to enter, such officer may apply to any magistrate for a search warrant. The magistrate shall issue the warrant if he believes from the supporting affidavit or affidavits that there is probable cause to believe that a source of air contaminant exists or is being constructed or operated on the premises to be searched.

Northern Nevada Public Health Air Quality Management Division (AQMD) has determined that STC Ventures, LLC is in violation of the District Board of Health Regulations Governing Air Quality Management PART 040.030 DUST CONTROL.

1. VIOLATION

- A. Failure to obtain a Dust Control Permit prior to commencement of a dust generating activity (1) acre or greater.

2. BASIS OF VIOLATION

A. Regulatory Authority

The District Board of Health Regulations Governing Air Quality Management paragraph 040.030.C.3. - DUST CONTROL PERMIT REQUIREMENTS:

The owner and/or operator of a dust generating activity shall apply for and obtain a Dust Control Permit prior to commencement of the dust generating activity. In the Dust Control Permit application, the owner and/or operator shall designate a person responsible for compliance with the "District Board of Health Regulations Governing Air Quality Management." Failure to comply with the provisions of an approved Dust Control Permit shall be deemed a violation of this Rule.

B. Facts to Constitute the Violation

On April 5, 2024 representatives of the AQMD conducted an air quality evaluation of the Yellow Brick Road project covered by Dust Control Permit No. APCP23-0068. During the evaluation the AQMD determined that dust generating activities were occurring outside the acreage covered by the Dust Control Permit. The AQMD advised that all activities in the in the unpermitted acreage must cease. The AQMD advised that an updated application must be submitted to the AQMD to add the additional acreage to Dust Control Permit No. APCP23-0068.

On April 10, 2024 a Dust Control Permit Modification form was submitted to the AQMD to increase the acreage for the Yellow Brick Road project.

SUMMARY

Northern Nevada Public Health, Air Quality Management Division (AQMD) staff recommends Notice of Violation (NOV) No. AQMV24-0015 be **upheld** and a fine in the amount of **\$500.00** be levied against STC Ventures, LLC for failing to comply with the provisions of Dust Control Permit APCP23-0068, specifically Condition No. 1: Visible fugitive dust emissions for a period or periods accumulating more than 5 minutes in any hour. This action is a minor violation of the District Board of Health Regulations Governing Air Quality Management (DBOH Regulations), specifically Section 040.030 (Dust Control) Section C (Standards) Subsection 1 (Visible Emissions Prohibition).

- 2. Healthy Environment:** Create a healthier environment that allows people to safely enjoy everything Washoe County has to offer.

PREVIOUS ACTION

No previous action.

BACKGROUND

Please refer to the attached NOV No. AQMV24-0015 for specific information. The NOV contains the facts associated with the incidents of noncompliance and supporting documentation relevant to the NOV.

NOV No. AQMV24-0015 and associated documentation supporting the NOV was sent certified mail to the offices of STC Ventures, LLC and was received on April 8, 2024. The certified mail contained instructions for filing an appeal of the NOV to the Air Pollution Control Hearing Board and the “Appeal Petition to the Air Pollution Control Hearing Board” form.

An appeal of NOV No. AQMV24-0015 was not exercised by STC Ventures, LLC within the 10-day appeal timeframe pursuant to paragraph 020.000.C.3 Appeal Procedure. As such, NOV No. AQMV24-0015 was determined to be final by the AQMD with a penalty amount of \$500.00.

FISCAL IMPACT

There are no fiscal impacts resulting from the Board upholding the issuance of the Notice of Violation and associated fine. All fine money collected is forwarded to the Washoe County School District to be used for environmentally focused projects for the benefit of the students.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the Board uphold an uncontested citation issued to STC Ventures, LLC, Case No. 1491, Notice of Violation No. AQMV24-0015, with a \$500.00 fine.

ALTERNATIVE

Should the Board wish to consider an alternative to upholding the Staff recommendation, as presented, the item should be pulled from the Consent Agenda for discussion. Possible alternatives are:

On February 29, 2024, a Senior Air Quality Specialist of the AQMD observed and documented over 5 minutes of visible fugitive dust from stockpiles and construction equipment operations on the Yellow Brick Road Project site via EPA Reference Method 22.



CHAPTER 020 - GENERAL PROVISIONS

PART 020.100 - VIOLATIONS OF REGULATIONS AND PENALTIES

SECTION A - VIOLATION OF REGULATIONS AND PENALTIES

1. VIOLATION OF REGULATIONS

- a. In determining whether a violation of these regulations has been committed, whether the violation was intentional or inadvertent is immaterial and does not constitute cause for dismissal of the case by the Hearing Board or District Board of Health. However, either board may consider whether the violation was intentional or inadvertent in determining the amount of the penalty to be imposed.

2. NOTICE OF VIOLATION

- a. Whenever the Control Officer or their authorized agent or representative has a reasonable cause to believe that any section of these regulations for the prevention, abatement or control of air pollution has been violated, the Control Officer shall cause written notice to be served upon the person or persons responsible for the alleged violations.
- b. The notice shall specify:
 - (1) The section or sections of these regulations alleged to be violated.
 - (2) The facts alleged to constitute the violation.
 - (3) Appeal procedure including any time limitations.
- c. The notice may include an order to take corrective action within a reasonable time, which shall be specified. Such an order becomes final unless, within ten (10) working days after service of the notice, a person named in the order requests a hearing before the Hearing Board.
- d. With or without the issuance of an order pursuant to paragraph 020.100.A.2.c:
 - (1) The Control Officer or their authorized agent or representative may notify the person or persons responsible for the alleged violation to appear before the Hearing Board at a specified time and place; or
 - (2) The Hearing Board may initiate proceedings for recovery of the appropriate penalty set forth in paragraph 020.100.A.3.
- e. Nothing in this section prevents the Hearing Board or the Control Officer or their authorized agent or representative from making efforts to obtain voluntary compliance through warning, conference, or other appropriate means.

3. CIVIL FINES AND PENALTIES

- a. Except as provided in paragraphs 020.100.A.3.b. and c., a violation of any section of these regulations constitutes a major violation. Failure to comply with any condition of an operating permit constitutes a violation.
- b. Any person who commits a major violation of any section of these regulations, other than paragraph 020.100.A.5. and SECTION 020.000.D., is guilty of a civil offense and may be required to pay an administrative fine of not more than \$10,000.00 per day, per violation. Each day of violation constitutes a separate offense. The District Board of Health may establish a compliance schedule as a part of any civil

finding either in lieu of, or in addition to, monetary penalties. Any fines assessed may be held in abeyance pending fulfillment of any compliance schedule.

- c. **Violations of PARTS 040.030 (Dust Control),** 040.035 (Open Burning), 040.040 (Fire Set for Training), 040.050 (Incinerator Emission), 040.051 (Wood-Burning Devices), 040.055 (Odorous Emissions), 040.080 (Gasoline Transfer and Dispensing Facilities), 040.200 (Diesel Engine Idling) or 050.001 (Emergency Episode Plan) of these regulations constitutes a minor violation unless there are three or more violations of any one of those PARTS by a person or entity, occurring within a period of twelve (12) consecutive months. All minor violations become major violations upon the occurrence of the third violation of the same PART within a period of twelve (12) consecutive months.

(1) The first offense of a minor violation shall result in an administrative fine of \$500.

(2) The second offense of a minor violation shall result in an administrative fine of \$1,000.

(3) Administrative non-compliance of the PARTS described in this paragraph (i.e. incomplete Dust Log, on site permit missing) shall constitute a warning. Any further administrative non-compliance with conditions of the PARTS described in this paragraph may constitute a violation.

- d. Administrative fines shall be levied by appropriate action of the District Board of Health and recorded in its official minutes. The evidence or information on which the District Board of Health bases its action may include any one or more of the following:
- (1) The recommendation of the Control Officer, or their authorized agent or representative, based on any Notice of Violation served on any person in accordance with these regulations if that person has not appeared or requested a hearing before the Hearing Board.
 - (2) The recommendation of the Hearing Board, based on its findings in connection with any appeal or other matter referred to the District Board of Health in accordance with these regulations.
 - (3) Evidence presented before the District Board of Health by any person, public official, or representative of the District Board of Health, provided the person charged with violating any of these regulations has received reasonable notice (at least twenty (20) calendar days in advance) of the hearing at which such evidence is to be presented and is provided an opportunity to present evidence in his defense at the hearing.
- e. Unless the District Board of Health bases its decision on the recommendations and/or findings of the Control Officer, their authorized agent or representative, or the Hearing Board as set forth in paragraphs 020.000.A.3.d.(1) and (2), the District Board of Health shall base its decision as to whether a violation of these regulations has occurred on the evidence presented before the District Board of Health pursuant to paragraph 020.100.A.3.d.(3). Irrelevant, immaterial, or unduly repetitious evidence shall be excluded. Documentary evidence may be received in the form of authenticated copies or excerpts if the original is not readily available and, on request, parties shall be given an opportunity to compare the copy with the original. Each party may call and examine witnesses, introduce exhibits, cross-examine opposing witnesses on any matter relevant to the issues even though such matter was not covered in the direct examination, impeach any witness regardless of which party first was called to testify and rebut the evidence against them. The District Board of Health may take notice of judicially cognizable facts and/or recognized technical or scientific facts within the District Board of Health's specialized knowledge. All decisions of the District Board of Health respecting administrative fines shall be in writing or notice of the District Board of Health's decision shall be forwarded to the aggrieved party at their last known mailing address.
- f. In those cases where it is determined by the District Board of Health that a violation of the Regulations has occurred, the District Board of Health, at its discretion, may choose to waive the fine for a first violation, levy any fine providing it does not exceed the appropriate range limitation, require use of other mitigation methods or schedules of compliance and, in emergency situations, require a stop work order to be issued and/or any other combination of remedies to bring about compliance with the regulations.
- g. All administrative fines collected by the District Board of Health pursuant to this section shall be deposited

Lee Squire moved to approve the July 31, 2024, agenda. Martin Breitmeyer seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

6. Approval of Draft Minutes.

March 14, 2024

Lee Squire moved to approve the July 31, 2024, minutes as received. Martin Breitmeyer seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Joshua Restori and Appellant, Ward Chilton, were sworn in by Mr. Lehman, Deputy District Attorney.

7. Recommendation of Staff to Uphold Notice of Violation No. AQMV24-0018, issued to STC Ventures, LLC for failure to obtain a dust control permit prior to the commencement of a dust generating activity, with an administrative fine of \$1,000.00 by the Air Quality Management Division and Appealed to the Air Pollution Control Hearing Board. (FOR POSSIBLE ACTION)

Chair Harris called staff to provide testimony on this case.

Josh Restori, Supervisor of Permitting and Compliance for the Air Quality Management Division, stated that the Appellant requested to provide testimony first.

Mr. Ward Chilton stood before the Board with a confession of judgement. He stated that he was aware that the Air Quality Management Division had been discussing STC Venture's project with his contractor named John Maxwell. Documents requiring Mr. Chilton's signature about the operation were received in his office from Air Quality Management Division. Mr. Chilton signed the documents thinking he was signing for the appropriate permit, until the notice of violation was issued by Air Quality Management with a \$500 fine.

Mr. Chilton verified the violations with Mr. Maxwell. Mr. Maxwell confirmed the dust control permit violation.

Mr. Chilton approved Mr. Maxwell to pay the \$500 fine and put Mr. Maxwell in-charge of the situation. Yet, shortly after, another notice of violation was issued by the Air Quality Management Division.

Mr. Chilton stated that he thought he was signing documents for proper permit. However, he also recognized the oversight on his part as the owner of STC Ventures, LLC.

Having heard his testimony, Chair Harris asked for suggestion on how to proceed with the motion.

DDA Lehman responded. He stated that the best thing to do is to follow the agenda, or follow the Staff recommendation. He also offered whether Chair Harris would like to hear a presentation or review documentation placed before him and/or make the motion base on the

statement provided by Mr. Chilton.

Chair Harris asked the Board if they had any questions for Mr. Chilton.

Martin Breitmeyer asked: “I understand that Mr. Chilton was the signer of the permits, why did the fine not go to Knox? It sounds like they are the infractor for the second time.”

Josh Restori responded: “The applicant is the responsible official associated with the permit, therefore any noncompliance issues would fall on that responsible official. Even though there is a contractor of record onsite, there will be multiple contractors of record as the project proceeds however there is an individual responsible for compliance at that site”

Mr. Breitmeyer said that he was just curious because he thought it fell to the contractor on record when they were doing the operation under the permit. He knew he pulled the permit, but he thought it fell to the contractor when he was operating under the permit, because he had to follow the permit.

Chair Harris stated that he was able to verify that Mr. Chilton’s name was on the permit application.

Josh Restori responded by referring to a column on a page with names of responsible individuals associated with the permit.

Mr. Squire stated that essentially, the buck stops on him.

Anthony Dimpel moved to Uphold Notice of Violation No. AQMV24-0018, issued to STC Ventures, LLC for failure to obtain a dust control permit prior to the commencement of a dust generating activity, with an administrative fine of \$1,000.00 by the Air Quality Management Division and Appealed to the Air Pollution Control Hearing Board.

Lee Squire seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

8. Board Comment

Chair Harris called for comments from the Board.

Having no additional Board comments, Chair Harris closed the Board Comment period.

9. Public Comment

Chair Harris opened the public comment period.

Having no public comment, Chair Harris closed the public comment period.

10. ADJOURNMENT

Mr. Squire moved to adjourn the meeting. Mr. Dimpel seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Chair Harris adjourned the meeting at 6:30 p.m.

Response to Public Comment: The Air Pollution Control Hearing Board can only deliberate or take action on a matter if it has been listed on an agenda properly posted prior to the meeting. During the public comment period, speakers may address matters listed or not listed on the published agenda. The *Open Meeting Law* does not expressly prohibit responses to public comments by the Air Pollution Control Hearing Board. However, responses from the Air Pollution Control Hearing Board members to specific items presented during public comment, which are not listed as agenda items could become deliberation on a matter without notice to the public. On the advice of legal counsel and to ensure the public has notice of all matters the Air Pollution Control Hearing Board will consider, Board members may choose not to respond to public comments, except to correct factual inaccuracies, ask for Northern Nevada Public Health staff action or to ask that a matter be listed on a future agenda. The Air Pollution Control Hearing Board may do this either during the public comment item or during the following item: “Board Comment – Hearing Board Member’s announcements, reports and updates, request for information or topics for future agendas. (No discussion among Board Members will take place on the item)”
