95.060	Park hours: Sunrise to Sunset. No person, except county employees or enforcement officials on official business, may be present in any county park after closing hours unless prior authorization has been issued by the director.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.070	Curfew Limitations: Curfew may apply to persons under 18 years of age unless accompanied by an adult or with prior written permission.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.080	Payment for Use of Facilities: Areas requiring a fee must not be used unless the user has paid the established fee for that particular facility.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.100	Group Permit: Groups in excess of 25 are required to have a group use permit.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.110	Concession/Operation: Selling products or operating a business is not allowed without a permit.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.120	Commercial Filming/Professional Photography: Commercial photography and/or filming requires a permit.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.130	Posting of Signs and Notices: Signs and notices posted in parks require a permit issued by the director.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.140	Landing of Aircraft: Air craft of all types may not take off or land in County parks without written permitt issued by the director.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.150	Aerial Apparatus: Remote control vehicles and aircraft are not allowed except in marked areas. Remote control vehicles and aircraft cannot be used in a way that poses a threat or disturbs the peace.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.160	Vehicle Operators: Operators of motor vehicles must have a valid license. The director may permit operation of other certain vehicles by persons who do not meet the requirements contained in 95.160.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.170	Registered Vehicles Required: Vehicles must be properly registered, unless otherwise permitted by the director.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.180	Speed Limit: The speed limit in parks is 15 MPH, unless otherwise posted.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.190	Roads/Parking: Motor vehicles shall be opertated only on roads or in parking areas designated for motor vehicles. Vehicles shall be parked in designated parking areas only.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.200	Bicycles and Other Operator Propelled Vehicles. No person may operate a bike or other operator-propelled vehicle in areas defined as unsafe or inappropriate. Speed must be restricted to a reasonable and prudent manner.	\$200	\$400	\$800

95.210	Unauthorized Use of Trails: Operation of motorized vehicles on trails and holding events on trails without consent of the director is prohibited.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.220.1	Leash Law/Animal Control (leash): Animals must be on a leash with maximum length of 6 feet and under immediate control of a person. Animals may not be on a beach adjacent to a body of water or within the water designated for bathing/swimming. Animals must not be left unattended in a vehicle in conditions that present risk to health and safety.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.220.2	Leash Law/Animal Control (removal of animal): An enforcement officer may take measures, including the removal of an animal from the park area to protect park resources and wildlife and to protect the safety, comfort, and well-being of an person or domestic animal in the park area.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.220.3	Leash Law/Animal Control (prohibited areas): The director may prohibit animals in certain areas of county parks.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.220.4	Leash Law/Animal Control (waste removal): A person must carry a waste container for the removal of animal feces and immediately remove the feces and properly dispose of it.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.230	Horseback Riding/Designated Areas: No person may lead or keep a horse or other large domestic animal in a county park except on roads, trails or areas designated and posted for such use. No person may hitch a horse in a manner that may cause damage.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.250	Fires/Disignated Areas/Regulation: Fires shall be contained in designated pits, fireplaces, gas/charcoal grills, stoves, or lanterns. No fire shall be left unattended. When finished, the user must fully extinguish the fire before leaving. No fires are allowed during fire restrictions.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.260	Property Defacement: No person may destroy or deface county property. Permission to post bills or advertisements must be permitted by the director.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.270	Trash/Litter: No person may litter, bring trash into the park and take trash out of trash cans and/or dumpsters.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.280	Firearms/Archery Devices: The discharge of any type of firearm and/or archery weapon is prohibited in county parks except in designated shooting or archery facilities. Firearm and archery facilities may adopt reasonable rules governing the discharge and all persons must strictly adhere to those rules.	\$200	\$400	\$800

95.290	Pyrotechnics and Liquid or Solid Fuel Model Rockets: Pyrotechnics and/or model rockets of all types are not allowed in county parks, unless permission is granted by the director.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.300	Disturbing the Peace: No person may conduct him/herself in such a manner as to disturb the peace in any county park or facility at any time. This includes making unreasonably loud noises, using “fighting words or gestures”, or otherwise inciting violence. A person in violation shall be ordered to immediately cease. If the subject(s) fail to comply a citation will be issued. A person may be asked to immediately leave the facility upon repeated failure to comply with any provision of this code. Refusal to comply shall constitute trespassing. No person may conduct or participate in a disorderly assemblage in any county park.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.310	Sound Amplification: Amplified noise emitted from electronic equipment is not allowed unless permitted by the director.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.330	Nudity and Disrobing: No person may publicly appear nude or disrobe in a county park except in authorized areas of buildings for that purpose.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.340	Possession and Consumption of Alcohol or Controlled Substances: Alcohol is allowed in designated areas only. It is unlawful for any person to possess or use any controlled substance prohibited by NRS chapter 453 in any county park facility.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.350	Smoking and Vaping Prohibited: Smoking and/or vaping are prohibited in all parks and open spaces, except in designated areas.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.355	Food and Beverage Prohibited in Designated Areas: No person shall possess or consume food or beverages in areas posted where food and beverage is prohibited.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.360	Sewage Dumping/Sanitation: No waste, water, sewage or effluent from sinks, portable toilets or other plumbing fixtures may be deposited directly upon or into any county park except in a specified dump station.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.370	Manner of Authorized Activity: No person may participate in any activity in a manner that endangers the health and safety of participants, park users and the general public or presents a reasonable risk of damage to park resources or property.	\$200	\$400	\$800

95.380	Camping/Designated Areas: No camping is allowed in undesignated areas of a park. Campers age 17 years old or younger must be accompanied by an adult unless prior written permission has been given. One adult may supervise a maximum of 15 juveniles.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.390	Number of Persons/Vehicles Occupying Campsites: Except in areas designated as a group site, the maximum number is 7 people and 2 vehicles per camp site.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.400	Time Limits on Camping: No person may continually camp for more than 7 days in a 30 day period, unless permitted by the director.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.410	Occupancy Right of Campsites: No other person may use or claim an occupied or reserved campsite. A site is considered occupied when it is being used or has been reserved with fee paid.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.420	Use of Food Storage Lockers: Before leaving a campsite unoccupied or when retiring for the night, food and beverages must be secured in an animal resistant locker or in a vehicle away from animal access.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.430	Plant Harming: Disturbing plant life in any way is not allowed unless authorized by the director. Paid campers may collect downed deadwood for firewood.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.440	Animal Harming: Disturbing any animal within the park is not allowed. Wildlife research may be conducted as authorized by the director in compliance with local, state, and federal regulations. Fishing requires a valid license.	\$200	\$400	\$800
95.450	Excavation or Disturbing Features of Cultural or Historic Site: No person may knowingly destroy or deface historic or prehistoric site areas, nor remove such items from county parks.	\$200	\$400	\$800
