SUMMARY

Washoe County via Washoe County Sheriff's Office Detention Center receives SAVE access through the Nevada State Office of the Attorney General.

BACKGROUND

The Nevada Office of the Attorney General transitioned the state's victim notification system from VINE (Victim Information and Notification Everyday) to Nevada S.A.V.E. (Survivors, Advocates, Victims, and Enforcement) Notifications in 2025 to modernize and improve statewide victim notification services. Originally implemented through a federal SAVIN grant in 2010, VINE provided automated custody status notifications for offenders across Nevada detention facilities and criminal justice agencies. According to the Attorney General's Office, Nevada S.A.V.E. replaced VINE with a more streamlined offender-based system that allows victims to register once for notifications tied to an offender rather than separately for each incident, while also offering enhanced customization options such as blackout periods and off-hours notification settings. The transition was coordinated statewide among law enforcement, corrections, parole, and victim advocacy partners to ensure continued compliance with Nevada law requiring a

statewide victim notification system and to improve the overall efficiency, continuity, and user experience of victim notifications throughout Nevada.
