Food Safety Plan Review & Operations

Special Processes & Program Standards Team

- The Special Processes & Program Standards Team launched a revised Active Managerial Control (AMC) Program webpage with help from NNPH Communications Team. The new webpage includes all the AMC Program instructional videos in both English and Spanish. Additionally, new resources on the webpage include quick-reference guidance documents for writing policies to control for the six most common critical violations observed in food establishments. There are also quick-reference guidance documents for developing training programs and verification protocols within food establishments. This webpage and the associated resources are to be used in conjunction with the AMC Program course and Food Safety Overview course that is taught twice monthly by members of the Special Processes & Program Standards Team.
- Senior EHS Olivia Alexander-Leeder traveled with EHS Trainee, Ryan Rennie, to the NACCHO Mentorship End-of-Year Meeting in St. Louis, MO, from October 28 to November 1. In 2024, the NNPH Food Safety Team has served as mentors to the Detroit Health Department Environmental Health and Safety Program, the Yolo County Environmental Health Division, and the Commonwealth Healthcare Corporation Environmental Health and Disease Prevention (out of Saipan, MP). The NACCHO Mentorship is a grant-funded program that matches mentor and mentee jurisdictions across the United States to share information and uplift each other in attaining adherence to the FDA Retail Food Program Standards. At the End-of-Year Meeting, NNPH representatives participated as panelists for the mentor breakout session, presenters for the site-visit highlights section, and table leads for the Standard 9 workgroup. As presenters for the site-visit highlights section, Olivia and Ryan shared the incredible work accomplished by NNPH and our mentees in the Retail Food Program Standards during the 2024 cohort.

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Food Safety Plan Review

• Staff completed the construction and opening inspections for a new grocery facility called El Super on located over on Oddie Ave. This facility will have full-service bakery, grocery, meat area, and deli.

Temp Foods / Special Events

• The largest event in October was The Great Italian Festival, which had over 90 temporary food permits to inspect and spanned 2 days in Downtown Reno. NNPH staff also worked the Reno Air Show, Several Pumpkin Patches and Fall Festivals, Day of the Dead, The Offbeat Music Festival, Oktoberfest events, and more.

Foodborne Disease Program

• Staff conducted one environmental assessment at a local food establishment after receiving three foodborne disease complaints for the facility within a 30-day period. While conducting the environmental assessment and associated routine inspection, inspectors observed six critical violations and issued a Fail score to the food establishment. The food establishment operator was required to attend the Active Managerial Control (AMC) Program course and will receive a reinspection to verify development of meaningful food safety policies and control of foodborne disease risk factors within 30 days.

Commercial Plans / Development Reviews

- Commercial Plan staff met the regional goal, reviewing 90% of all plans within the regional time frame for the month of September.
 - Year to date, EHS staff have reviewed 74% of commercial plans within the regional goal of 14 calendar days.
- EHS Commercial Plans received 155 plans during the month of October, resulting in 229 different reviews by EHS Staff.
- 62% of plans submitted in October were revisions, while 52% of plans were revisions year to date.
- Specific information regarding New Commercial Plan reviews submitted and Revised Commercial Plan reviews has been added and will be included in the chart below going forward.
- The Plan Review team has been working with a hotel owner and developer to address inconsistencies with lighting requirements to operate the outdoor pool and spa after dark. Staff worked to find a solution and will be conducting a field verification.

Permitted Facilities

- NNPH Permitted Facilities staff completed opening inspections for a hotel.
 - Approximately 6 rooms remain to be inspected and released for occupancy due to missing items and delays.
 - o The associated pool and spa permits have also been issued and they are operating at this time.
- Staff are reviewing multiple projects with mercury remediation proposals required to develop the areas. These specific reviews take an immense amount of time to complete the review as well as validate all sampling data and proposed work.

Environmental Protection

Residential Septic & Well Plan Reviews

- Septic and well inspections picked up during October, likely due to contractors trying to get work done before winter hits.
- The team finalized a troubleshooting guide for use on septic and well inspections. This guide will be useful for newer inspectors as they come across situations in the field where modifications to the approved plan have occurred.
- The Sewage Wastewater and Sanitation (SWS) Advisory Board heard a variance request for a septic system to be built on a property where municipal sewer is available. The SWS Board recommended approval of the variance request and it was heard by the District Board of Health and approved.

Safe Drinking Water

- Two sanitary surveys were completed in October. Six water systems remain to have a survey for 2024. All surveys are expected to be completed for the year. Holy Spirit Catholic Church was inactivated during October due to it being a total loss from the Davis Fire.
- In the month of October, the team issued a Level 1 Assessment at one public water system due to confirmed positive bacteriological sampling. Level 1 Assessments.
- Team leadership worked to ensure all Washoe County Public Water Systems can comply with the
 Lead and Copper Rule Revisions and complete their Lead Service Line Inventory (LSLI) by the
 October 16, 2024, deadline. All systems except one met the deadline. Once the LSLI's were received
 team leadership began reviewing them and requesting revisions where appropriate. Many inventories
 have required NDEP guidance and input, and staff continue to follow up on these inventories.
- Three team members attended the American Water Works Association California-Nevada annual
 conference held at the Reno Sparks Convention Center. This conference covered current and
 upcoming regulatory requirements that apply to many of our regulated public water systems in
 Washoe County.
- The Verdi Mutual Water Company public water system had a positive source water sample test for E. coli during October. Team leadership consulted with NDEP staff regarding the appropriate response which included a Boil Water Order and a site visit. The site visit identified a few items that the public water system needs to correct, and copies of all current backflow test results have been requested. The water system has also been placed on monthly E. coli source water monitoring to help determine if the E. coli positive was an anomaly or a larger issue.

Vector-Borne Disease Program

- All routine collections of adult mosquitoes have concluded for the 2024 calendar year.
- Staff submitted a single California Ground Squirrel for rabies/plague testing following a human exposure in East Sparks.
 - The animal tested negative for rabies and plague results are still pending at the time of this report.

- UST staff inspected 19 fuel sites in for the month of October.
- UST Staff witnessed closure of two sites this month. One site removed the tanks and piping, and the other site did a closure in place. Staff was also on site to witness assessment activities and have yet to receive closure reports.

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• Staff has received notification that a new system is being installed in November and notification that another site will be closed as well.

• WM staff issued three Biohazardous Waste Generator permits for each Renown site. All known biohazardous waste generators in Washoe County are now permitted.
