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**SUBJECT:** Recommendation to approve allocation of American Rescue Plan Act

(ARPA) funds through the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery

Fund (SLFRF) for the following projects:

a. Emergency Eviction Prevention Program of Nevada (EEPPN) for (\$200,000), to assist 200-250 households at risk of homelessness over the next 12 months through housing stabilization advisory and resource navigation, preservation of rental history, and preservation of relationships between landlords and tenants.

Recommendation to approve an increased allocation to the previously approved project:

- b. Increase funding for the Innovative Seniors Program, by \$200,000 for a total of \$300,000 to include senior center auditorium improvements through removal of ceiling, a new stage, and installation of new light fixtures.
- c. Increase in funding for the Behavioral Health Crisis Stabilization by \$326,696 for a total of 451,696 to support the facilitation of strategic planning and implementation of a sequential intercept model (SIM) in Washoe County and implementation and transition for the behavioral health crisis response system project management to Washoe County.

The total amount of increased allocations is \$726,696. If approved, direct the Comptroller's Office to make necessary net zero cross-fund and/or cross-functional budget appropriation transfers. Manager's Office. (All Commission Districts.) FOR POSSIBLE ACTION

#### **SUMMARY**

The report requests approval of one new external project, the Emergency Eviction Prevention Program (\$200,000) to assist 200-250 households at risk of homelessness over the next 12 months. The report also includes two amendments of previously approved ARPA-SLFRF projects including renovations of the 9th Street Senior Center auditorium (\$200,000), and additional funding for the Behavioral Health Crisis Response Plan (\$326,696).

<u>Washoe County Strategic Objective supported by this item</u>: Fiscal Sustainability, Economic Impacts, Vulnerable Populations, and Innovative Services

## PREVIOUS ACTION

On March 19, 2024, the Board of County Commissioners approved additional allocations in the amount of \$303,197; to the following new projects, Human Services Agency GenArete Pilot Program (\$49,500), which will utilize a dynamic tool to create high quality, individualized learning plans for children with developmental disabilities; Permanent Supportive Housing – Supportive Services Needs Assessment (\$28,000), which will provide funds to conduct a comprehensive needs assessment for supportive services in Northern Nevada; and approved an increased allocation to the previously approved project: for the District Attorney's Office – Court Case Backlog Personnel Workstations by \$225,697 for a total of \$616,429 to cover fire and seismic requirements as well as increased construction costs.

On December 13, 2021, the Board of County Commissioners approved an allocation in the amount of \$2,423,414 to the District Attorney's Office to reduce the court backlog by hiring attorneys, investigators and support staff whose sole focus will be to close these cases. Funding includes workstations for grant funded staff, and related facility improvements (\$390,732).

## **BACKGROUND**

On March 11, 2021, the American Rescue Plan Act was signed into law, and established the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund and Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund. Washoe County was awarded a grant of \$91,587,038 in State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF).

The total fiscal impact of these allocations is \$726,696. Ongoing maintenance and operation costs past the allocation period will need to be secured via the annual budget process through reallocation of existing budget or submission of an above base budget request for the appropriate fiscal year.

Should the board approve the projects as submitted, the FY24 ARPA SLFRF COVID-19 Recovery (Fund 270, Fund Center 270-8) and CIP SLFRF Projects (Fund 402, Fund Center 402-10) budgets will be adjusted with the following cross-fund and/or cross-functional net-zero appropriation transfers:
