SUBJECT: Recommendation to accept the 2024-2025 Division of Public and

Behavioral Health funds from Nevada Department of Health and Human Services [amount not to exceed \$5,889,962, no match required] to be used to fund new personnel, associated operating expenses, to include recruitment costs, and equipment from March 15, 2024- December 30, 2025, authorizing the creation of 10.0 FTE Deputy Sheriff Positions and 1.0 FTE full time Sergeant funded 100% by these funds, as such, if grant funding is reduced or eliminated, the position hours will be reduced and/or the positions will be abolished accordingly unless additional funding is secured; if approved, direct Comptroller's Office to make the necessary budget amendments and Human Resources to create the positions. SUMMARY

This funding is received from the Nevada Department of Health and Human Services to support the collaboration between Washoe County and the Division of Public and Behavioral Health. The goal of this Jail Based Mental Health Program is to introduce treatment at an earlier time in the assessment prior to adjudication of individuals with mental illness. The overarching goal and expectation of this Jail Based Mental Health Program is to mirror the intensive therapy clients receive at Lakes Crossing Center, the only maximum-security psychiatric facility providing comprehensive forensic mental health services in Northern Nevada. When individuals are court ordered to Lakes Crossing Center, it is for evaluation and/or treatment for restoration to legal competency. This Washoe County Jail Based Mental Health Program will reduce the time needed for evaluation prior to transfer to Lakes Crossing Center for the treatment for restoration to legal competency.

Washoe County Strategic Objective supported by this item: Vulnerable Populations; Coordination between agencies and communication of programs.

BACKGROUND

Funds are to be utilized by the Washoe County Sheriff's Office to design, support and enhance the Jail Based Mental Health Program. This funding from the Nevada Department of Health and Human Services will provide a Law Enforcement Team comprised of one Sergeant and ten Deputy Sheriffs. These full-time positions will integrate with existing staffing to form a team dedicated to reducing the time needed for evaluation prior to Lakes Crossing Center for the treatment for restoration to legal competency.
